The photographs from this project were made in the "Village of Peace" community in Dimona, Israel. The community was established nearly 40 years ago by the African Hebrew Israelites. Originally a group of black Americans, mostly from the Chicago area, they left the U.S. in the late 1960s, lived in Liberia and finally settled in Israel's Negev desert.
