

John Sabraw

Professor, Chair of Painting Dept., Ohio University

Sabraw is an artist, an activist, and environmentalist. The main focus of his research currently is working with a team of engineers and watershed experts to remediate streams polluted by acid mine drainage from abandoned coal mines

Sabraw has partnered with Engineering Professor Guy Riefler to extract toxic acid mine drainage (AMD) from polluted streams in Ohio and turn it into paint pigment. Some of the artworks utilize the raw materials or pollutants, and in others the artist uses technological instruments through digital interface, e.g. laser cutters and computer driven routers, to burn or excavate natural materials, thereby enacting the very scorched earth practice of resource extraction

in America. There is a terrible beauty in the resulting artworks that balance the delicate with the brutal.

As an artist, writer, letterpress printer, designer and illustrator, Gaylord Schanilec has set the standard for contemporary artist's books over the last 40 years. Lac des Pleurs—a study of the 22-mile length of the Upper Mississippi River known as Lake Pepin is featured in this exhibition along with prints and fine press books as well as printing blocks formed from the natural materials collected along the river bank.
