
## Four Allies, Four Questions for LGBTQ Liberation at **Pesach (2013)**



The traditional seder emphasizes the number four. In the Haggadah, there are four questions (typically recited by the youngest participant), four symbolic children, and the consumption of four cups of wine. Keshet, an organization that advocates on behalf of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender Jews, rewrites these texts in order to educate allies and prospective allies about how to create more inclusive Jewish communities.

## **Traditional Haggadah**
