1889 FTI Diary

- 09 [price in cents?] Frank T. Ives West Granville Mass. Jan 22. 1889
- Jan 1 [Tues.] Warm and pleasant. Father went out to Mr. J. Halls got 10 lbs 10 oz honey. Burt + I went to school and to meeting in the evening.
 - Warm and pleasant. Father drew up a load of wood & packed some butter and honey to send to New Jersey. He also packed some eggs and put up some potatoes to take to Winsted. Burt and I went to school.
 - Wery warm and pleasant. Father went to Winsted. Sent a box of butter to Uncle Joes' folks in New Jersey. Burt and I went to school. I did the chores at noon.
 - 4 Cool and cloudy. Father tried to saw but the toggle-pin in the gate came out twice. Burt and I went to school.
 - 5 Cool and cloudy. We sawed eight logs for Mr. Slocum and one for Mr. Nelson. I drew home two loads of wood, took one load of plank to Mr. Slocum.
 - 6 Cold and rained hard all day the trees were all covered with ice. Father Burt and I went to Church the sermon preached by Rev Mr Haynes from South Framingham. Father carried Mr. Haynes to Tolland.
 - 7 Warm and rainy cleared off just before night and froze up some. Father went up to Dea [?] Parsons, over to Mr. Snows and to store. Burt and I went to school.
 - 8 Warm and pleasant. Father went to Riverton with a load of corn and rye had it ground. Burt and I went to school and to meeting in the evening.
 - 9 Mild and rained hard all day. Father put some sticks over mangers. Burt and I went to school.
 - 10 Warm and pleasant. Mr. Haynes came over took supper and Father carried him down to meeting in evening we all went. Burt and [blank, meant to add "I"?] went to school and did Gilbert Millers chores at noon and father did them at night.
 - 11 Warm and pleasant. Father drew up some wood and slabs. He also drew in a lot of logs. Burt and I went to school.
 - 12 Cold and windy. Father and Burt sawed in mill. I drew up 2 loads of wood and 3 of saw dust.
 - 13 Warm and pleasant. We all went to Church, the sermon was preached by Rev C E Haynes. We all went in the evening.
 - 14 Warm and pleasant. Father went to Otis to see John Cotton. He got a turkey of Frank Barnes. He settled with him and Mr. Cotton. Burt and I went to school.
 - 15 Warm and pleasant. Father cut up some slabs and drew up a load of boards. Burt and I went to school and to meeting in the evening.
 - 16 Cool and cloudy, Commenced raining in the evening. Father sawed beech logs for Vincent A. Howard helped him [sic] Burt and I went to school and to G. E. Slocums to a society in the evening.
 - 17 Warm and rained hard nearly all day cleared off just at night. Father worked in the mill. All helped him. Burt and I went to school.
 - 18 Cool and pleasant. Father finished sawing for Mr. Barnes. He and Mother went down town. Hattie came home with them. Burt and I went to school. Burt was sick and came home in the afternoon.
 - 19 Cold raw and windy. Father and I fixed the race and filled in around the tube [?]. Father carried Hattie home in the evening.
 - 20 Pleasant but chilly. Snowed in evening. We all went to Church but Burt went in the evening.
 - 21 Cold and windy. Benjamin Jones came up in the afternoon. He and Father packed a barrel of butter, clock faces, clock works, printing [?] etc.
 - 22 Mild and pleasant. Father went to Winsted. Aunt Electa came home with him. I went to school and to meeting.
 - 23 Cool and cloudy with some signs of a storm. Father fixed the river road. Father Mother and Carrie went to society.

Page 2 FTI 1889

- 24 Warm and pleasant. Father bolted down packing box and packed the shaft. Burt and I went to school.
- 25 Warm and pleasant. Father sawed beech for V. E. Barnes. Burt + I went to school.

26

- Cool and cloudy. We sawed two or three logs in the forenoon and finished sawing beech for V. E. Barnes in afternoon. Mother and Carrie went down to Aunt Emelines Carrie had her hair cut.
- 27 Cool rained hailed and snowed all day. It snowed enough to make good sleighing. We did not any of us go to Church.
- 28 Cool cloudy and windy. Father carried Aunt Electa over to New Boston. Stopped to Grandpas brought home a stove. Burt and I went to school.
- 29 Cold and windy. Father went down to Mr. Hitchcocks put the sled together then went down to E. Malisons [?] to get his horse but could not. Burt and I went to school.
- 30 Cool but pleasant. Father went up to Beech Hill. He stopped at Parsons pond cut 2 caked [meant to write "cakes"?] of ice it was 11 inches thick.
- 31 Warm and pleasant. Father took a load of potatoes, eggs and butter to Winsted. Bert [sic] and I went to school.

Feb 1

- Very windy and cold. Bert [sic] and I went to school. Father drew out the water in the west well.
- Warm and pleasant. We went down to Mr. Hitchcocks got the sled in forenoon went up to Parsons pond in afternoon and cut 51 cakes of ice. Lyman Marks died.
- 3 Cold and windy. Snowed some in afternoon. Father Burt and I went to Church.
- 4 Cool and pleasant. Father and Burt cut ice on Parsons pond. Gilbert Miller had our horse to put with his and drew six loads of ice. I had his cattle and drew three loads.
- Warm cloudy and foggy rained a little just at night. Gilbert drew five loads of ice with the horses. I went to Tolland with oxen in forenoon drew one load of ice in afternoon.
- 6 Cold and very windy. We cleared out the ice house and packed what ice we had. Father and mother went to society.
- 7 Cold and very windy. Father and Burt cut ice. I drew down three loads with the horses. We finished packing about 275 cakes in all.
- 8 Cold and windy snowed a little in the afternoon. Father and I went down to Hiram Parsons' [sic] lot and drew out logs and took one load to the mill.
- 9 Warm and cloudy snowed a little in the afternoon. Father drew logs. Burt and I dind [sic] the chores and cart brush and wood in the afternoon.
- 10 Warm and pleasant. We all went to Church in the day and Burt and I in the evening. The sermon was preached by Mr. Tate.
- 11 Warm and pleasant. Father and Burt went to Winsted with both horses and brought home a load of grain. I did the chores and I helped George Treat pack ice.
- 12 Cold and windy. I helped George pack ice a while in the forenoon and split wood some in the afternoon. Father d[r]ew logs. Burt went to meeting in the evening.
- 13 Cold and windy. Father drew logs. Burt and I did the chores and chopped alder in afternoon. Mrs. Frost came up stayed all day.
- 14 Warm and pleasant. Father drew logs, and a load of beech wood. Burt and I chopped wood in the after noon.
- 15 Warm and pleasant. Father drew logs. Burt + I helped Mr. Nelson and Ed break out the south road in the forenoon chopped in the afternoon.
- 16 Warm and pleasant. Father drew logs. Burt and I cut up what beech wood there was at the house.
- 17 Cool and cloudy signs of a storm in the day but cleared off and was pleasant in the evening. We all went to church in the day and in the evening.

Page 3 FTI 1889

18 Cold and stormy rained some. Father worked in the shop part of the day. We went to rehearsal in the afternoon. We all went down to the entertainment in the evening.

- 19 Cool windy and cloudy. We drew up three loads of wood from the mill and father drew up five loads of alder. Burt and I cut alder wood in the afternoon. I did Gilbert Millers chores at noon.
- 20 Cool and pleasant. Burt and I drew up three loads of saw-dus[t] in the forenoon. Father took Mother and Carrie down to society then he went over to Milo Millers auction.
- 21 Warm and pleasant. We had Gilbert Millers' cattle and drew up two loads of hay from Squire Goodwins barm [sic]. Father went over to Milo Millers just at night brought home what he bought at auction.
- 22 Cool and pleasant. Father drew logs. Burt and I did the chores and cut up a lot of alders [sic] into stove wood.
- 23 Cold but pleasant. Father drew logs. Burt helped him in the forenoon. I did the chores and went down street in the evening.
- 24 21 below [Snell = -5, MAC = -2; both coldest of the winter]. Cool but pleasant. We all went to Church in day. Father Burt and I in the evening.
- Cold and stormy in the morning but cleared off. Gilber[t] Miller came up and got his horse and took it down to D[?]ut[l?]ton, he sold it to him. Father went out to Tolland and got Rastus Smith's horse to work a few days.
- Warm and pleasant. Father drew logs and brought up a load of alder wood at night. Burt and I did the chores and chopped alder in the afternoon. Burt went to meeting in evening.
- 27 Warm and snowed in the afternoon. Father drew logs part of the day. Brownie came in she had a bull calf.
- Warm and pleasant. Father drew logs. I cut up what wood was drawn and helped George pack 30 cakes of ice. Robert Pease came and got a gathering tub that father bought of Mr. Fenn [?]. Robert traded one that [?] is over at Allen Howards for fathers.
- Mar 1 Very warm and pleasant. Father drew logs. Mother went down to Hiram Parsons with him then she came up to Talcatt [?] Coes [?] and up to Albert Hitchcocks and came home at night. Carrie went down to Mr. Hitchcocks. Burt and I chopped alders.
 - Very warm with some clouds. Father drew logs all day. Burt and I did the chores. Burt went down in the morning with Father helped him get one load.

Warm and cloudy rained some in the morning. We all went to Church in day and in the evening.

- 4 Cool and cloudy snowed some in the afternoon. Father went to Winsted. I took Mr. Smith's horse home in the forenoon.
 - Warm and rainy. Father went down to Mr. Thomas Hayes in the morning. I did the chores and split up some wood. Father, Carrie, Burt and I went to meeting. Mr. Tate didn't come over.
- 6 Warm and cloudy. Father Mother and Carrie went down to Society.

- 7 Warm and pleasant. Father worked gumming [?] the saw. I drew up three loads of wood to the house and two loads of slabs to the sap plale [meant to write "place"?]. Father took a load of sawdust down to his shed just at night.
- 8 Cold and windy. Father carried Nettie Dixon to Winsted. Burt and I cut and split half a cord of wood and lift [sic] some more logs could not split.
- 9 Cold and windy. Father drew down two loads of wood from the north lot. Burt and I cut up three trees. Father painted part of the kitchen in the afternoon.
- 10 Cool but pleasant. We all went to Church in day. Burt and I went in the evening.
- 11 Cool but pleasant. Father went to Riverton with a load of corn. Burt put in 4 window glas[s] in the school hous[e] in forenoon. Burt and I sawed and split wood for George in afternoon.

Page 4 FTI 1889

- Warm and pleasant. Father helped Gilbert Miller sort apples. Burt went over to Tolland with Mr. Millers ox in the forenoon went down and got Ed Wetherwax's wagon in afternoon. I drew up three loads of sawdus[t] and one of wood.
- 13 Warm and pleasant. Father and I went down to Hiram [?] Parsons and cut ten chestnut trees. Andrew Hunt worked drawing long logs out to the road all day.
- 14 Warm and pleasant. Burt worked for Gilbert Miller. I drew up 3 loads of wood. Father and I sawed up what logs there was on log way.
- 15 Cool and windy. Burt worked for Gilbert Miller. I drew up 2 loads of wood in morning, father drew up 1 at night. We took down sap tubs in afternoon drew out and stuck up the boards in board way.

16

- Warm and windy. We scalded the tubs and set sap place [?]. Sap ran well. I drew up two loads of sawdust for George. Father and Burt cut up some slabs. Father, Mother and Carrie went over to Grandfathers stayed all night[.] Burt and I went down to Rob Peases [?] in the evening.
- 17 Cold and cloudy rained some. Father, Mother and Carrie came home from Tolland.
- 18 Warm and pleasant sap ran well. Father went over to town meeting. Burt and I gathered up the sap and sirruped [sic] off in the evening. I cut bushes in the afternoon.
- 19 Warm and pleasant. We sawed on Milo Marshalls logs and fixed the race 3 times. Burt helped George set sap trees in the afternoon.
- 20 Cool and cloudy snowed in the after noon and evening. Father went to Winsted. Burt and I gathered up the sap and sirruped off. Burt went over and got his hair cut in the afternoon. Burt and I went down to society in the evening.
- 21 Warm and pleasant. We finished sawing Milo Marshalls logs, between 3 and 4 thousand [board feet?] in all.
- Warm and pleasant. I drew up 2 loads of saw dust and Burt gathered up his sap in the forenoon. Father fixed up the dray and the Nelson boys drew in some of their logs.
- 23 Warm and pleasant. We sawed logs for Mr. Nelson. Burt sirruped [sic] off in the mor[n]ing.
- 24 Very warm and pleasant. We all went to Church. Hattie came up stayed all night.
- Very warm and pleasant. We fixed the race in the morning then sawed on Mr. Nelsons logs all day. I carried Hattie home in the evening.
- 26 Very warm and pleasant. We worked on Mr. Nelsons logs. Burt went to meeting in evening.
- 27 Cool and cloudy. We finished sawing Mr Nelson's logs 10181 in all. Burt and I gathered up sap in afternoon. I went to the mill got a load of wood.

28

- Warm But snowed hard all the forenoon. Burt sirrupped [sic] off just at noon. Father and Mother went up to Mr. Henry Parsons in the forenoon. Father painted in the kitchen in the afternoon.
- Warm and pleasant. We drew in Mr. Parsons logs and drew up 2 loads of wood in the forenoon. We sawed Mr Parsons hemlock logs in the afternoon. Burts sheep had 2 lambs.
- 30 Cold and windy. Father took the buggy wheels, spring and box irons out to the black smith [sic] shop then went out to Mr J. P. Halls and got some honey in the afternoon. Burt and I gathered sap and sirruped [sic] off.
- 31 Cool and snowed hard all day but turned into sleet in the evening. Father went up to Aunt Eliza's in the evening.

Apr 1

- Warm and rained hard all the afternoon. We went down to Mr Goodwins got a load of hay. I drew up a load of slabs to the sap place and Burt sirruped [sic] off. Mothers sheep had one lamb.
- 2 Warm and cloudy. I helped Gilbert Miller sort apples. Burt went over to Tolland with Gilbert Millers ox in the forenoon picked over apples in the afternoon. Father painted in the kitchen some. My sheep had 2 lambs.

Page 5 FTI 1889

- Warm and cloudy snowed some just about noon. Burt worked for Gilbert Miller. Father finished painting the kitchen and painted some in the parlor chamber. I emptied the sap tubs and drew up a load of wood in the forenoon.
- 4 Warm and pleasant. Father went part way up to Westfield with a load of apples for Mr. Miller. Burt and I cut brush.
- Warm and pleasant. I helped Mr. Miller gather sap in the forenoon and part of the afternoon. We split two of Mr. Parsons logs. Burt and I gathered up the sap.
- 6 Warm and pleasant. Father went to Winsted with butter. He sent a box of honey and butter to Uncle Joe. Burt and I sirruped [sic] off just ant [sic] night.
- 7 Warm and pleasant. We all went to Church in the day all but I in the evening. A Mr. Stone from H[?]eathe preached. Father carried him to Tolland.
- 8 Warm and pleasant. We fussed on the gate most of the forenoon, split some of Mr. Parsons logs. We drew a load of wood to the sap place and a load to the house. Burt gathered and boiled sap all day.
- 9 Warm and pleasant. Burt sirruped [sic] of[f] about noon. We finished splitting Mr. Parsons logs sawed 6 for Vincent Barnes and 5 for Milo Marshall. Father sawed shingle in the afternoon. Puss came in.
- 10 Warm and pleasant. Father finished sawing Mr. Parsons' shingle in the forenoon. We rolled in 7 of Fathers chestnut and split part of them and finished packing Mr. Parsons shingle.
- 11 Warm and pleasant. Father sawed shingle in the forenoon and finished splitting the logs on the log way in the afternoon.
- Warm and cloudy sprinkled a little. Carrie, Burt and I went over to Grandpas' [sic] in the morning came back after dinner and drew home the buggie [sic] wheels from Mr. Munds [?]. Father sawed shingle all day. I stacked [?] 1¹/₂ M in afternoon.
- 13 Warm and pleasant. Allen Howard came over and drew in a lot of chestnut logs. We split up logs and sawed some shingle.
- Warm and pleasant. We ^{all} went to Church in morning. Burt and I went in the evening. Preaching by Mr. Gibbs.
- Warm and pleasant. Father went to West Hartland with a calf and then to Riverton and got some grain. Burt and I fixed the fence around the big pasture.
- 16 Warm and pleasant. Father sawed shingle in the forenoon. We split logs in the afternoon. We set out 7 plum trees that we got of John Hodges in the morning.
- 17 Cool and cloudy sprinkled a little in the forenoon. I drew up 2 loads of wood and we gathered the sap tubs. Father sawed shingle in the forenoon and a part of the afternoon. We split up one log and part of another. Father and Mother went to society.
- 18 Cool and cloudy. Father wen[t] to Winsted. Burt and I packed five thousand shingle and went a fishing a little while in the afternoon. We caught 3 trout.
 19
 - Very warm and pleasant. Father sawed shingle in the forenoon. Burt and I drew out 12 thousand of shingle and took home a load of lumber at noon. We split some logs in the afternoon.
- 20 Very warm and pleasant with a shower in the afternoon and evening. Father sawed shingle most of the day we cleaned out the mill and fixed the skids. Father and Mother went down street in the evening.
- 21 Warm and pleasant. We all went to church sermon by J W. Gibb [sic]. Burt went to meeting in the evening.
- 22 Cool and windy. I went down to Robert Peases and to the store and Mr. Gorhams to get my hair cut in the forenoon. Father finished sawing his shingle and sawed three logs into plank. Gilbert Miller came over and drew in all but 4 of his logs.
- Warm and pleasant. We sawed all but one of Mr Millers poor logs into plank and split one log in shingle blocks. Father went to the store in the evening.

Page 6 FTI 1889

Warm and pleasant. Father went over to Charles Treats and Terretts and got some potatoes and apples. He made some grafting wax and grafted in the afternoon. Burt and I fixed the fence around the little pasture. I went over to Granpas [sic] and got some cions [meant "scions"?].

- Warm and pleasant in the fore noon cloudy and windy in the afternoon. Father grafted all day. Burt and I manured and plowed the garden. Burt sowed some lettuce and planted pease [sic] and onions. I went down to the church with mothe[r] and helped put down some oil cloth. Andrew Hunt plowed in south lot.
- Cool and rained just at night. We sawed one log into plank and split one into shingle blocks. Father sawed one log into shingle and we packed one thousand. Father grafted one tree in the mill yard. C [sic]
- 27 Cool and rained hard nearly all day. We split up four logs in the fore noon. Father sawed shingle in the after noon [sic]. Burt and I packed 3 ¹/₂ thousand of shingle.
- 28 Warm and cloudy. We all but Mother went to Church. Sermon by Rev. H. J. Stone. Father carried Mr. Stone to Tolland.
- 29 Warm and pleasant. We split up the rest of Gilbert Millers logs that were on the log way. I drew up three loads of slabs and posts. Mr. Hayden of Blandford came down and got 1000 lbs of Phosofate [sic].
- Warm and pleasant. A. J. Howard came over and drew in Robert Peases' and V. E. Barnes logs. Father sawed shingle. We packed 4 ¹/₂ M. of shingle. Uncle Del and Eddie came over and got some potatoes. Eddie stayed over.
- May 'Warm and pleasant. Father finished sawing Gilbert Millers shingle and we split one of R. Peases logs. Eddie and I packed some shingle. We cut the pigs in the afternoon. Father and Mother went to society. Eddie Burt and I went a fishing we got 10.
 - 2 Warm and pleasant. We finished splitting Peases logs and Father nearly finished sawing them. I drew up a load of plank and a load of timber.
 - Warm and cloudy, sprinkled a little in the morning. Father went to Winsted. I packed two thousand of Gilbert Millers' [sic] shingle. 14 thousand in all.
 - 4 Warm and pleasant. We sawed the rest of Vincent Barnes logs and hauled away [?] sawed Peases logs. Burt and I got out a wood chuck up near the raceway.
 - 5 Very warm and pleasant. We all went to Church and Burt and I went to Tolland in the evening. Father carried Mr. Stone to Tolland mother went with him.
 - Very warm and pleasant. Father took the little sow down to Linus Barnes and went up to Emery Barnes and paid his interest in the forenoon. I finished picking up the stone on the rye piece. We manured and plowed the piece next to pasture.

Warm and pleasant. We plowed the oat piece and sowed the oats. I harrowed the piece next to the pasture and we planted most of it to potatoes. We drew manure onto the potato piece.

- 8 Very hot and pleasant. I harrowed in the oats in the morning and then we finished manuring the potato piece.
- 9 Very hot and pleasant. Father plowed on corn and potato piece all day. I cut potatoes in the forenoon. Planted some potatoes and cucumbers in the garden and mowed brush next to the wall on corn piece in the afternoon.
- 10 Very hot with a shower in the afternoon and one in the evening. Father nearly finished plowing. I planted some pole beans and burned some [?] brush.

Hot and showery. Father sowed the oat piece to grass seed and finished plowing the corn and potato piece. I b[r?]ushed in the grass seed. Burt and I went a fishing. Burt caught 8 I caught 11.

12 Warm and pleasant. We all went to Church. Burt and I went to meeting in the evening.

Page 7 FTI 1889

- 13 Warm and pleasant with a shower In [sic] the evening. I harrowed the potato piece and we planted some.
- Warm and cloudy in forenoon pleasant in afternoon with a hard shower in the evening. We sawed 2 finished [?] sawing Rob Peases logs and sawed Milo Marshalls cherry in the forenoon. We planted potatoes in the afternoon.
- Warm and pleasant. Father and I put up some barbed wire fence next to the brook on the north lot in the forenoon. We planted 7 short rows of potatoes and plowed the garden. Father, Mother and Carrie went to society. Aunt Rose died this morning.
- 16 Warm and pleasant. I finished fixing the fence on the north lot and planted 6 rows of potatoes. Father made a butter box in the morning and went over and got Grandpa in the afternoon. Aunt Selindy came over in the afternoon.
- 17 Very warm and pleasant. Father and Grandpa went to Winsted and down to Ansonia to Aunt Roses' [sic] funeral they came up to Uncle Wills and stayed all night. I finished planting potatoes in forenoon. Helped George plant in the afternoon.
- 18 Very hot and pleasant. Grandpa and father came home. Burt and I hoed and planted a little in the garden. We went in swimming in the afternoon.
- 19 Very warm and pleasant. Father carried Grandpa over to Tolland center. We all went to Church. Burt and I went to meeting in the evening.
- 20 Hot with some hard showers. We got out a few loads of manure on the corn piece. We set in some posts across the garden. Mother worked cleaning the parsonage.
- 21 Warm rained some in the forenoon. I went over to Alls got some swill and brought home a load of sawdust. Father finished sawing Peases shingle and we cut up a lot of slabs. I cut a lot of bean poles and planted some beans.
- 22 Warm and pleasant. Father and I drew manure onto the corn piece.

30

- 23 Brownie [?, at top of page] Warm and pleasant. I harrowed part of the corn piece. We planted 1 acre of corn.
- 24 Susie [top of page, she came in?] Warm and pleasant. We drew manure onto the corn piece part of the day plowed a little and I harrowed. Father planted a little corn.
- Warm and pleasant. Father planted corn a while in the morning then he sheared the sheep. I harrowed the rest of the corn piece and Burt and I finished planting the corn.
- 26 Cool and cloudy rained a little in the morning. We all went to Church. Burt and I went to evening meeting.
- 27 Cold and rained some. Father and I set in some posts next to wall on east side of the garden and built over the barn yard fence. Father painted the parlor chamber.
- 28 Warm and pleasant. We finished the henyard and built a yard part way around the pig yard.
- 29 boards [?] Warm and pleasant. Father and I straightened up a lot of boards for V. E. Barnes in the forenoon. We built some fence and to[ok?] the old sow down to Linus Barnes boar.

Cool and cloudy rained some in the afternoon. I harrowed the north end of the turf ground. Father and Burt finished the hog yard and got one hog into it. Burt went fishing caught 11 trout.

- 31 Hot and rained some. We worked cleaning and painting the buggy most of the day.
- Jun 1 Cold and rained hard most all of the day. Father and Burt went to Winsted. I built a hen roost.
 - 2 Warm and pleasant. We all went to Church. Burt and I went to meeting in the evening.
 - Very warm and pleasant. We got some pea-brush in the forenoon. Ben came up in the afternoon helped us load up a load of clocks guns [or gunk=junk?] etc etc for Mr. Fenn [?]. We cultivated out a little piece of potatoes and corn next to the pasture.
 - 4 Warm and muggy rained some in the afternoon. We drew some logs onto the logway in the forenoon and went down and sawed them in the afternoon.
 - Warm and pleasant. Father went to Meriden and stayed all night with Mr. Fenn [?]. I b[r?]ushed and hoed the peas, planted some corn and beans, and hoed some.

Page 8 FTI 1889

- 11 Very hot with a very hard shower just at night. We hoed most of the north end of the potatoes.
- Warm and cloudy rained some in the afternoon. We got out some manure and set out 65 cabbage plants. I planted some peas and some sweet corn.
- 13 Very warm and pleasant. We cultivated out the potatoes again. I harrowed the buck-wheat in the fore-noon we hoed in the afternoon.
- 14 Very hot and pleasant. Father and I hoed potatoes in the forenoon. Father sawed some logs for O. E. Slocum I hoed in the afternoon.
- Warm with a hard shower in the afternoon. Father and Mother went to Winsted got home about 11 o'clock. Burt and I finished hoeing potatoes.
- 16 Warm and pleasant. With a shower in the evening. We all went to Church.
- 17 Warm and rained quite hard all the forenoon. We put the springs onto the buggy and Father finished painting it. Father and mother took a pig down to Burt Peebles and went down to Arial Frosts.
