ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This structure is one of a group of post medieval buildings in Granville which share common architectural features such as 1st and 2nd story overhangs, corner boards and a large central chimney (#30, #32, #97, #104). This 2-story, 5-bay gable-roofed residence features a center hall entry covered by an entry porch with brackets and paired brackets at the roof edge. Synthetic siding has obscured any other details.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

J.B. Bancroft owned the property in 1855 and served the Town as Selectman and was a Lieutentant during the War of 1812. R.W. Tryon was the resident in 1870. J. Jenson took over the property after 1894 and it is still owned by the Jensen family.
