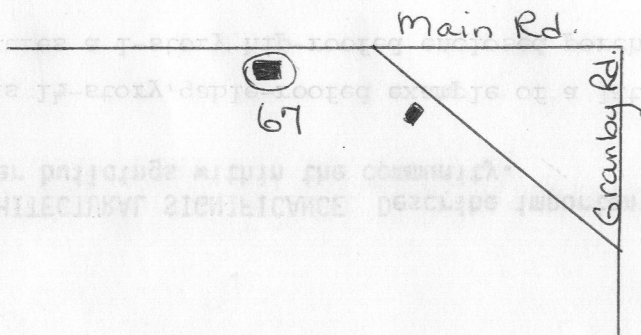

This residence is shown on the maps of 1894 and 1912 as the property of Mrs. N. Goddard (or Godard). She and her husband, Nelson, were very instrumental in the organization of the Universalist Church in Granville.
