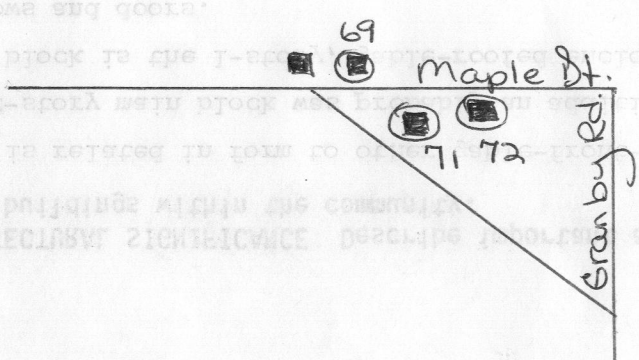

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This is related in form to other gable-front-and-wing structures(64, 66,67, 85, 86). The 2-story main block was probably an addition to the 1-story wing. A feature of the main block is the 1-story, gable-roofed enclosed porch. Plain trim surrounds both windows and doors.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

The property was occupied by L.T. Spelman in 1855 - 1870, A. Gillett in 1894 and M.E. Seymour in 1912.
