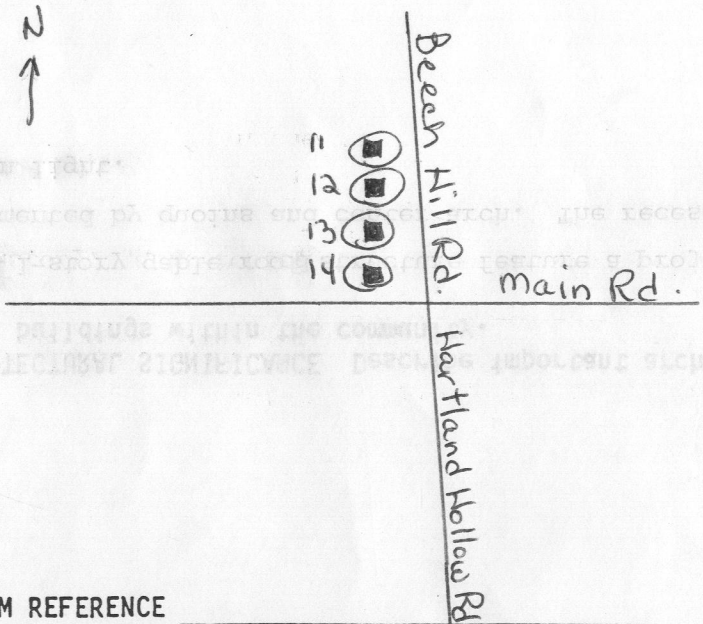

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 1-story, gable-roofed structure feature a projecting pavillion with gable roof ornamented by quoins and center arch. The recessed door is flanked by sidelights and a fan light.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Because of the deep valley dividing the east and west sections of Granville, transporting students to a central school was not convenient. Therefore, after the school was built in east Granville, residents of West Granville voted to build a much needed school for students in that area. The Town appropriated \$15,000 in 1935 for the purpose and the building was completed in 1934.
