

This was one of the many small schoolhouses that served Granville from the mid-19th century to the early 20th. Granville was divided into many districts and this school was designated to serve the South Lane District of the Middle Parish (West Granville). It is shown as a schoolhouse site on the maps of 1855, 1870, 1894 and 1912.
