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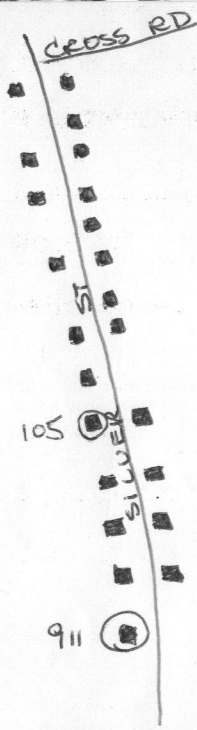

The marker is of dressed granite with the date 1906 and the place names of G. Mass and G. Conn carved on it. (Granville, MA/Granby, CT)

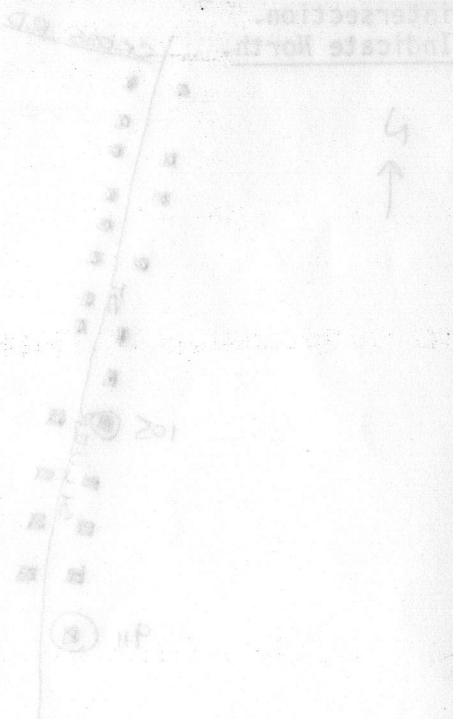
HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain historical importance of object and how the object relates to the development of the community.
