

Education Case, by Sophia Case (1807-1900)

"A common education for young gentleman is far more important than that of young ladies, for the mental faculties of young ladies are sufficiently bright, whereas the gentleman need bountiful education and greater cultivation to make them equal with the ladies. Deprive the male sex [illegible] of education and our country would at once sink into ignorance whereby on the other hand deprive the female sex of education and it would make no essential difference in civilization.

Sophia Case was from Canton and married Jephtha Rose. They lived in Granville and owned a home on Granby Road (now gone) not far from the intersection of Silver Street. You can find photos of the house as well as Sophia and Jephtha on the Granville History site.
