




Figure A1. July 30, 1829, Abigail Rose, widow of Revolutionary War artilleryman Abner Rose, requests her relation Francis Stebbins be appointed administrator of her late husband's estate. Francis Stebbins was active in the affairs of Granville, serving on a committee that wrote to President Thomas Jefferson requesting suspension of the Embargo Act of 1808; and represented the Town of Granville at the state constitutional convention of 1820 (Wilson, 82, 85). 

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

Detail image showing Abner Rose's 1829 inventory still relates to a tavern, years after his tavern license of 1784, which enabled him to earn an income (in addition to farming) as an innkeeper after his life-threatening injury during the Revolutionary War. It includes "5 punch bowls," wine glasses, bottles, etc. Abner Rose's inventory was taken thirty-five years after he signed off on the sale in 1794 of his father Daniel Rose III's home to Lieutenant Jacob Baldwin, and suggests Abner Rose continued to participate in running a tavern, possibly in his family's former home while the Lt. Baldwin Tayern was open (1794-1799) and during the Baldwin family ownership thereafter [see Phelon Geske PART 2.1:46-48] and through 1813, even though no license is indicated for Rose during that period. 


Figure A3. Final accounting of Abner Rose estate prepared by Francis Stebbins and signed by his relation Abigail Rose, May 3, 1832. Book 34, 443: [Abner Rose, no will; Probate Record 9590; Abigail Rose 9591]. Francis Stebbins, like Abigail was from Springfield; he married Chloe Bates of Granville in Granville in 1796. Francis and Chloe's son Francis Ball Stebbins was born in Springfield in 1799; and it appears that the couple were living with Abner and Abigail Rose, according to the 1800 Census; and for subsequent years. 


Figure A4. Marriage record of Abigail Stebbins of Springfield to Ab(e)ner Rose on February 8, 1781 during the American Revolution. After their marriage, Abigail related that they went to live in "the house of his (Abner's) father (Daniel) in Granville." Abigail and Abner were married by the Rev. Robert Breck of Springfield. Abigail was born October 8, 1757, the daughter of Ebenezer Stebbins (1733-after 1766) and his wife Hannah Day Stebbins (1733-1767) who were married 13 June 1754. 

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

"Eber Rose Son of Daniel and Achsah his wife was born June the 20 day 1748; Daniel Rose the Son of Daniel Rose and Achsah his wife was born December the 11 day 1749; Abner Rose the Son of Daniel Rose and Achsah his wife was born September the 23 day 1751; Russell Rose the Son of Daniel and Achsah his wife was born June the 10 day 1753... Marcy the daughter of Daniel Rose and Achsah his wife was born February 22, 1757."

The Daniel Rose family could have part of, or the reason for, the story Leona Clifford related of a new baby born to the family of Daniel's brother David Rose, during the night with no candle lit due to fear of an Indian attack. The Borning Room window of the Daniel Rose House on the western slope of Prospect Mountain, faces westward, placing its occupants without blackout curtains, at risk from an enemy's distant vantage point. The first child born to Daniel and Achsah Rose, Eber Rose was born in late June 1748, shortly after a peace treaty was agreed to between Britain and France, on April 30, 1748, signed as the Treaty of Aix-la-Chapelle (October 18, 1748), which ended King George's War (1744-1748), the third of the four French and Indian Wars in British North America. However, by the terms of the treaty, Fort Louisbourg captured through the major effort of the Massachusetts Bay colonists, was returned to the French, setting the stage for the fourth war, known in British North America as the French and Indian War (1754-1763) during the Seven Years War waged in Europe. Six Rose family children were born during the fourth war: Enos, 1755; Marcy the 'first', 1757; Achsah 1758; two daughters Louisa and Elizabeth who appear to have been twins, each with a birth record of August 1, 1760; and Seth born in 1762. 
