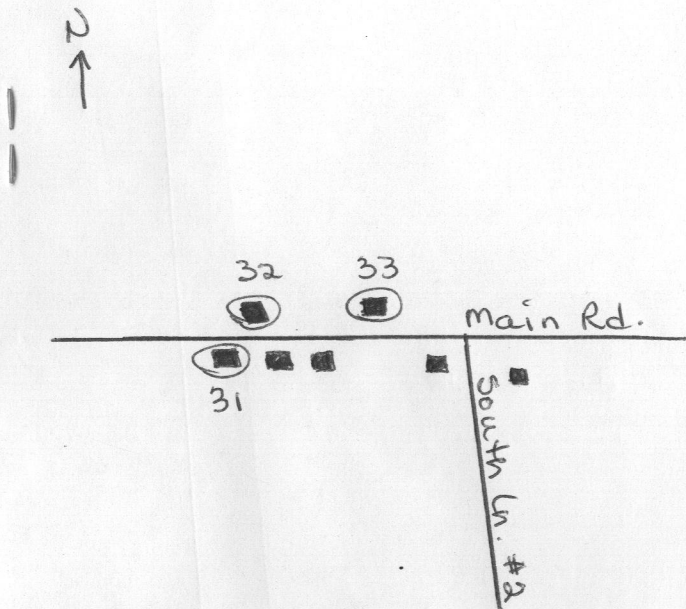

**ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE** Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This structure is one of a group of post-medieval buildings in Granville which share common architectural features such as 1st and second story overhangs, corner boards and central chimney (#27, #35, #104, #92, #63, #37, #30, #32) The 2-story, 5-bay saltbox displays overhangs at the 1st and second stories. The otherwise unadorned exterior is enhanced by dentils at the roof cornice and an elaborate 2 leaf door surround by pilasters supporting a transom and cornice.

**HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE** Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Miss Atkins resided in the house between 1855 and 1870. L.J. Dustin is shown as the occupant in 1894.
