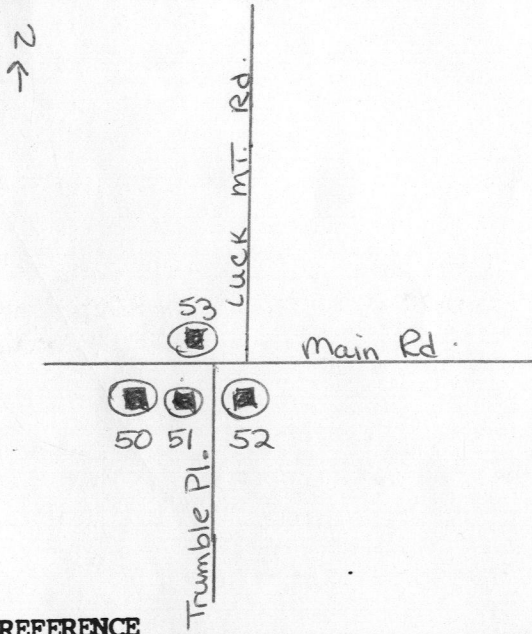

**NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)**

**ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.**

This building is similar in style to #1. The 2-story, 5-bay gable-roofed structure has very little ornamentation found only in the simple architrave trim around the doors and windows. The hip-roofed entry porch with turned posts and spandrels is typically Queen Anne and was probably added in the late 19th century.

**HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.**

In 1855, the property was owned by Timothy Cooley. Mrs. C. Black was the occupant in 1894. In 1906, Mrs. & Mrs. Elliot Barnard owned and occupied the property. Mrs. Barnard was the librarian of the library branch that was located in the house. The house became part of the church property in 1912.
