 - 3 Cool and windy. We all went to Church. We young folks went down to meeting in the evening.
 - 4 Cold and windy. I carried Myrtie down to South Lane, came home and went down and got a load of saw-dust. Father sawed out what shingle blocks we had split up. Gilbert Miller came over with his team and helped us build a road down through the gravel bank to the pond.
 - 5 Cold but pleasant. Father Mother and Gertie went over to Grand father's and spent the day. I packed up 3¹/₂ M. of shingle. We went down to C. E. [Christian Endeavor?] in the evening.
 - Cold and windy snowed quite hard part of the day. Father and I went down to the mill and got a load of plank boards &c. In the after noon we went down to the shop and shod up the horse sled.
 - 7 Cold but pleasant. Father and I butchered of[f] the hog in the forenoon. We went down to Charlie Treats in the evening.
 - Warm and pleasant. Father went to Winsted. Andrew Hunt came up with his team and we went up and drew the logs that we had of J. W. Goodwin. Bert Carrie and Harry went to school.
 - 9 Warm and pleasant. Father and Bert made two doors and brought them up to the house. I drew up a load of saw dust and put it in the pig pen and drew up two loads of wood.
 - 10 Cool but pleasant. All of us except Mother went to Church. We young folks went to Meeting in the evening.
 - 11 Cool and cloudy stormed a little. I carried Myrtie over to school in the morning. Then Father and I fitted and hung the large doors in the new barn.
 - 12 Warm and foggy. Father worked planeing [sic] and matching boards for doors. I cut up what little wood there was drawn up. We went down to C. E. in the evening.
 - 13 Warm and foggy rained a little. I carried Carrie and Harry down to school. Father and I tried to shoe the light bobs but broke one shoe. but [sic] fitted and put on the other one.
 - 14 Warm and rained hard all day but cleared off in the night and begun [sic] to snow before morning. Father and I worked in the mill all day.
 - 15 Cool and snowed hard all the forenoon about 10 inches fell. Father and I worked in the mill in the forenoon. Father splut [sic] out some sled runners in the afternoon.
 - 16 Cold but pleasant. I drew up three loads of plank from the mill. Father worked down in the shop all day. Burt [sic] and I layed dow[n] most of the stable floor in the new barn.
 - 17 Cool but pleasant. All except Mother and Harry went to Church. We young folks went to Meeting in the evening and then carried Myrtie down to South Lane.
 - 18 Warm and rained considerable in the afternoon. Father went to Riverton took down 5 bu of potatoes toward a barrel of flour and some corn and had it ground. I chopped a little wood in the forenoon went over to Emersons [sic] Barnes' [sic] with a cow in the afternoon.
 - 19 Cool rained some in the morning and snowed some in the afternoon and evening. Father put together 2 small doors and then he fitted two shoes one for the light and the other for the heavy bobs. I churned in the morning the[n] I went down and drew up 4 doors from the shop. In the afternoon I worked in the shop with Father.
 - 20 Cold but pleasant. Father took off the forward shoes on the horse and sharpened them and put them on again. Then he went over to Henry Munns and got the horse shod behind. In the afternoon he and Mother went down to society. I chopped wood down beside the road on the little hill.

- 21 Cold but pleasant. Father and I hung two doors in the new barn in the fore noon. Father layed [sic] down some floor and put in a window in the barn in the afternoon. I chopped wood down beside the road.
- 22 Warm and pleasant. Father worked down in the shop all day. I churned in the forenoon in the afternoon I chopped down beside the road on the little hill.
- 23 Raw and cold with some snow squalls. Father and Bert went to Winsted. I split and piled part of the wood that I have cut. In the after [sic] Will Hunt came over and got a load of hay for Dr. Bartlett + I had to help him load it.
- 24 Cool and cloudy. All except Myrtie and Harry went to Church. Bert, Gertie and Carrie went down to meeting in the evening.
- Warm and pleasant. I carried Myrtie down to school in the morning than [sic] Father and I put in eight stanchions in the new stable and layed down part of the drop floor. While I was churning in the afternoon Father hung one of the stable doors.

- Very cold and windy. I carried Carrie down to school and took the saws down to Robert Peases' [sic] to get them filed. Father worked in the barn most of the day. Bert and I cut some wood.
- Cold and windy. Ther. stood at 12° below zero in the morning. Father layed [sic] down the floor to the space on the west side of the barn and commenced the mangers. I got up a load of wood and sawed, split and put it into the wood shed.
- 28 Cloudy with a raw cold wind. Father worked on the mangers most of the day. I churned in the morning and drew up two loads of wood in the afternoon.
- Warm and pleasant. Father and I put in a door on the north side of the barn. Father put in the partitions to some of the mangers. I made the catches to the stantions [sic] and put up $9^{1}/_{2}$ bu of buckwheat. We went down to meeting in the evening.
- 30 Stormy in the morning but cleared off and was pleasant in the afternoon. Father and I worked in the shop in the forenoon. I went to Riverton with $8^{1}/_{2}$ bu of buckwheat and 4 bu of potatoes brought back a barrel of flour a bag of cot. seed meal and a sack of bran.
- 31 Pleasant but windy. All except Gertie went to Church. Gertie, Myrtie, Bert and I went to meeting in the evening.
- Feb 1Pleasant with a raw cold wind. Father and I worked around the mew [sic] barn all day got it so that we put four cows into it.
 - Warm and cloudy in the morning snowed hard all the afternoon. Father worked down at the shop all day. I took the clorthen [possibly meant to write "clothes"?] over to Mrs. Hunt in the morning and chopped the rest of the forenoon. Bert and I split and piled a lot of 4 foot wood in the afternoon.
 - 3 Cool and cloudy snowed a little. Father shod the business sleigh. I churned in the forenoon, helped Father awhile in the afternoon.
 - 4 Warm and pleasant. Father and I put the light bobs to gether [sic] in the morning. Butchered two calves and one sheep in the afternoon.
 - 5 Warm and pleasant. Father went to Winsted. I worked on the wood pile most of the day.
 - 6 Warm and pleasant in the middle of the day. Ther. stood Zero in the morning. We cleaned the sawdust out of the ice house in the forenoon. Bert and I helped Gilbert in the afternoon. Bert cleaned out his ice house and I helped him draw logs.
 - 7 Cool and cloudy snowed some in the afternoon and rained in the evening. All except Mother went to Church. Bert Myrtie Gertie + I went down to meeting in the evening.
 - Warm and foggy in the morning but cleared off before noon. Father and Bert cut wood down in the little pasture. I went down to Gilberts and took over two loads of logs with his horses. Hired out to him for a month.

 - 3 Cold and cloudy rained some in the evening. Mr. Miller came up and went out to the Spring place and got a load of hay. Father and [sic] took the team and got the rest of it making in all six large two horse loads and one, [sic] one horse load.
 - 4 Warm and pleasant. Father and Bert boarded up one gable end and part of the north side of the corn house. I picked apples for Mr. Miller.
