ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 1-story, hip-roofed structure is dominated by a triparted round arched recessed entry centered below a gable wall dormer. The design may have been influenced by H.H. Richardson's late 19th century designs for libraries. His buildings typically had Roman arches and towers, elements found in the Granville Library.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

The land for the library was a gift from Milton B. Whitney and Ralph D. Cooley. Money for the town library was raised over a number of years by a group of Granville women who formed the Granville Library Club. Among the participants were Mrs. Ralph Cooley, Mrs. Orville Noble, Mrs. Silas Root, Mrs. Milo Seymour, and Mrs. Nell Gibbons. Fund raising began in 1896, construction commenced in 1900 and ended in 1901 and the library opened in 1902.




