




## Revolutionary Service.

Edmund Barlow appears with rank of 1st. Lieut. on muster and pay roll, Capt. William Cooley's Co. Col. John Moseley Hampshire Co. Regiment. Marched to reinforce the Northern Army under command of Lieut. Col. Timothy Robinson Roll dated at Grayville. Enlisted Oct. 21, '76. Discharged Nov. 17, 1776.

Edmund Barlow appears among a list of officers of the Mass. Militia, as 1st. Lieut in the 5th. Co. of 3rd. Hampshire Co. Regt. commissioned Apr. 26, 1776.

Edmund Barlow appears with rank of Lieut. on Muster and pay roll of Capt. Solomon Brown's Co. Col. Elisha Putnam Hampshire Co. Regt. Enlisted July 21, 1779. Discharged Sept. 1, 1779. Service at New London, Conn. Certified by William M. Olin Sect. of Rev. War. Archives Boston Mass. as from records index of same.
