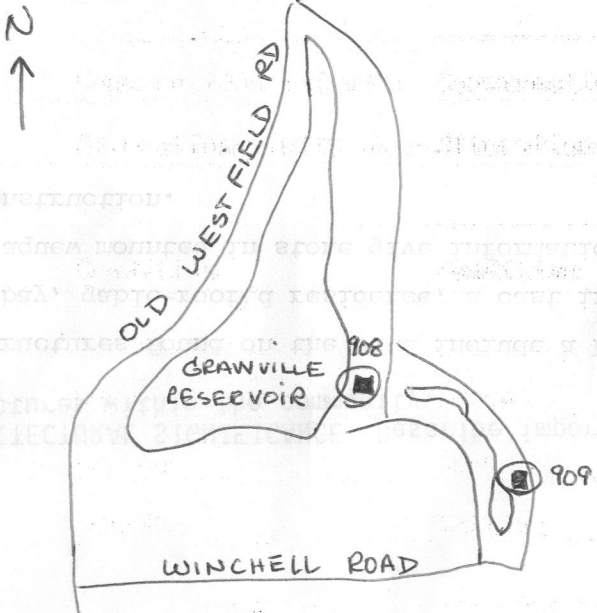

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important design features and evaluate in terms of other structures within the community.

Structures found on the site include a brick gatehouse with a slate hip-roof; a 2-story 5-bay, gable-roofed residence; a cast iron truss bridge and the stone dam. Bronze plaques mounted in stone give information about the participants involved in the construction.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain historical importance of structure and how the structure relates to the development of the community.

This was the last reservoir built for use by the City of Westfield. Construction began in 1914, but because of politics and lack of funds, it was not finished until 1928. The reservoir covers the location of the homestead of Samuel Bancroft.
