ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This building is related by design to #49, #69, #81. #82, #84, #89. The 2-story, 2-bay gable-front-and-wing residence features shingles and a small 3-panel rectangular window in the gable. A shed-roofed porch, enhanced by turned posts and a porch skirt with a diamond design, covers the entry.
