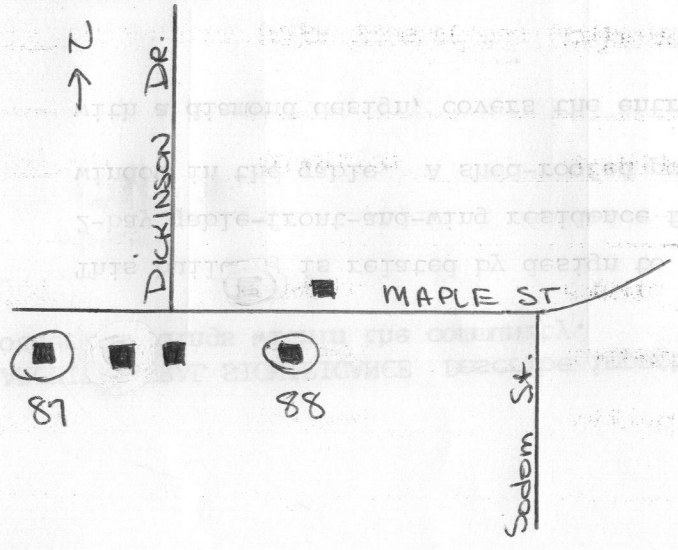

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This building is related by design to #49, #69, #81, #82, #84, #89. The 2-story, 2-bay gable-front-and-wing residence features shingles and a small 3-panel rectangular window in the gable. A shed-roofed porch, enhanced by turned posts and a porch skirt with a diamond design, covers the entry.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

The property was owned by M. Holcomb in 1912
