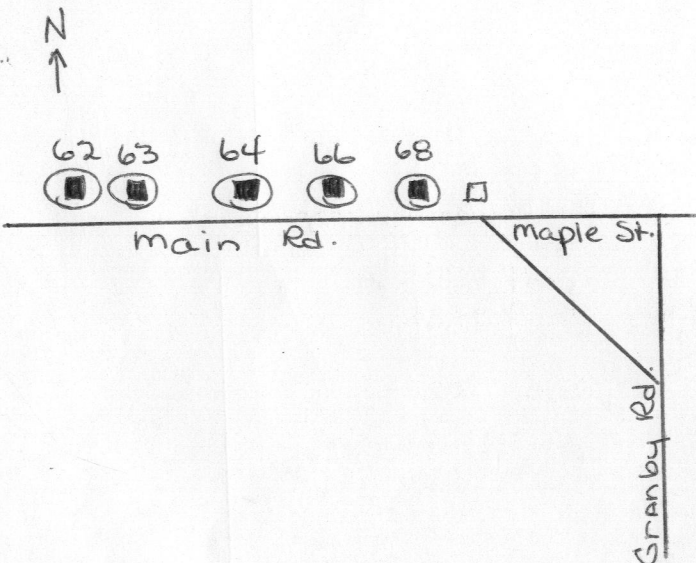

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 2-story, hip-roofed structure is one of the few examples of Colonial Revival architecture in Granville. The main feature of the house is the 2-story, gable-roofed portico on the south facade.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

This house was probably built after 1912 by Charles Thompson, Sr. A slaughter house and butcher were originally located on this site.
