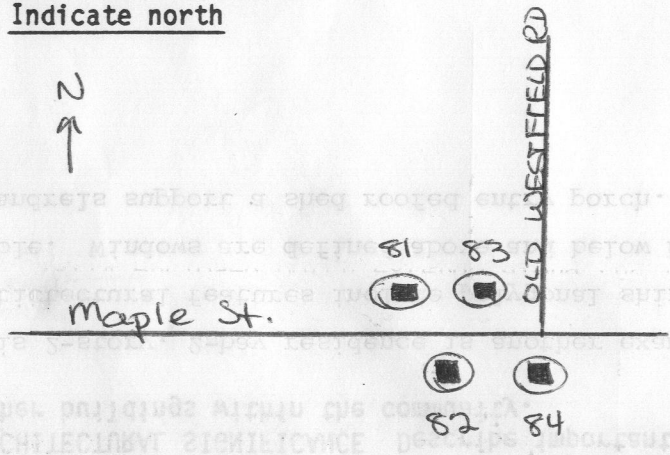

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 2-story, 2-bay residence is another example of the gable-front-and-wing massing. Architectural features include polygonal shingles and a multipaned window in the main gable. Windows are defined above and below by belt courses and turned posts and spandrels support a shed roofed entry porch.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

George L. Oysler built this house and is shown as occupant on maps of 1894 and 1912. He was a blacksmith in a shop on his property until his death in 1939.
