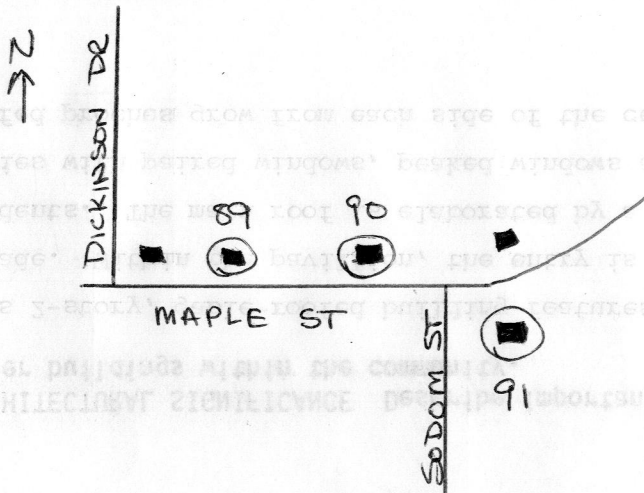

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 2-story, gable-roofed building features a projecting gabled pavillion on the main facade. Within the pavillion, the entry is surrounded by a door hood with brackets and pendants. The main roof is elaborated by a jerkin head and bargeboard. Window treatment varies with paired windows, peaked windows and window hoods supported by brackets. Hip-roofed porches grow from each side of the central pavillion.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

This house was built by the Dickinson family in 1873. E.D. Dickinson is shown in 1894 as the resident. He worked with his father Bevil C. Dickinson manufacturing drums from 1868 until 1900. Lester B. Dickinson owned the property in 1912. (See #91).
