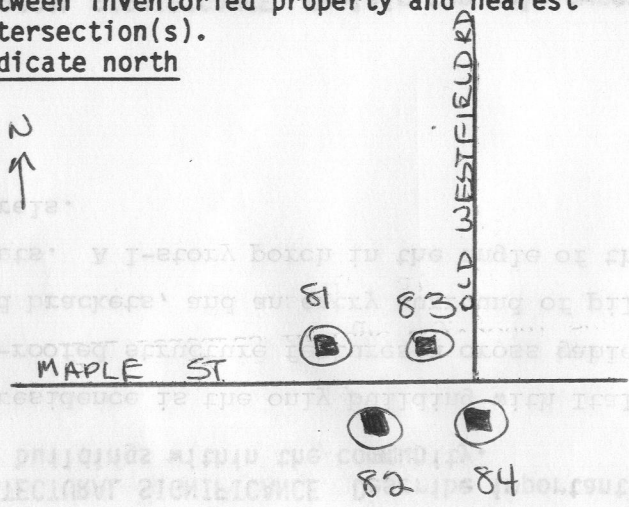

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This residence is the only building with Italianate details in Granville. The 2-story, gable-roofed structure features a cross gable, a 1-story bay with a heavy cornice and paired brackets, and an entry surround of pilasters supporting a cornice with paired brackets. A 1-story porch in the angle of the "L" is elaborated by turned posts and spandrels.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

David Rose, a descendent of Miles J. Rose built this house and lived in it until his death in 1915. He served as choir director of the Methodist Church and his wife was the organist. Rose was also elected a Selectman in 1893.
