

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe impother buildings within the community.

This 2-story, 3-bay gable-roofed structure has a side entry on the lateral eave facade of the house.

The door is surrounded by 1/2 sidelights supporting a segmented fan. An elliptical window enhances the pedimented gable end.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

Noah Cooley lived in this house during the first half of the 19th century. He was one of the initial donors for the establishment of the West Granville Academy. He served as a representative to the General Court in 1832 and also as a Selectman from 1829 - 1831.

The property was occupied by M. & K. Terrell in 1894 and 1912.
