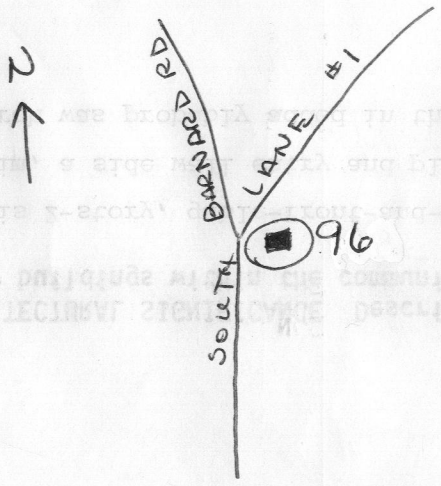

NATIONAL REGISTER CRITERIA STATEMENT (if applicable)

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.

This 2-story, gable-front-and-wing residence features wide eave overhangs, frieze board trim, a side hall entry and plain trim around the door and window. A 1-story enclosed porch was probably added in the early 1900's.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.

The residence was owned in 1855 by the Noble family. E.F. Roberts is shown as the owner from 1870-1912. He served as a Selectman from 1886-1890.
