We lived in the West End, grocery stores on every corner, one of which was my family's. My dad took me to school until I was in 7 th grade, then I walked.

7.	If you wished to travel what kind of transportation did you use? Did you travel when you were young? If so, where? My dad had a car and we traveled to Detroit to see my great aunt when I was 5 years old.

We observed all holidays and rituals, and went to private tutors to learn Hebrew. I went to Louisville Girl's High School, and was involved at the YMHA
