ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF DETACHMENT

PREPARATION AND ACTIVATION

EARLY in the fall of 1942, when it first became apparent that the Government would formulate a program to assure the training of an adequate number of persons in scientific and technical fields which would be essential to the national interest, the administration at Centre College wrote letters to those whom it felt would probably have something to do with the selection of colleges to give such training and offered the use of the facilities here, especially suggesting the advantages of the College for Women, and inclosed a brief prospectus setting forth these facilities. In December, however, the administration and faculty committee together made a careful and comprehensive survey of the total facilities of the college, the college for men and the college for women, separately and jointly. This survey included blue prints of both campuses and buildings on each campus and a description of them; capacity of

buildings for housing, feeding, instruction, physical training, equipment available, etc. All of this material was sent with a covering letter to the same people who had received their earlier material as well as to others, who it was now thought might have something to do with choosing the colleges for the Government training program. In the covering letter both colleges were made available if they were needed. Though it had offered both of the educational institutions, it became evident that the most practical plan would be for the Government to take over the facilities of the College for Men and for Centre College to make the Women's Division coeducational for the duration and transfer the civilian students there.

On December 11, 1942, the college received from the Office of Emergency Management, War Manpower Commission, Washington, D. C., a request that a questionnaire entitled "Survey of Colleges and Universities" be filled out

and returned to that office. This questionnaire was sent to all colleges and universities with the statement that it "should not be regarded as implying that a contract will be offered to any particular institution." It was designed to obtain comprehensive information needed by the armed services in connection with the Government training programs. Due to the detailed survey which had been made by the college of its facilities, it was possible to complete this questionnaire and return it immediately.

On 15 January 1943, a request was received from the War Department, Office of the Division Engineer, Ohio River Division, Columbus, Ohio, for a report on college facilities as outlined in a simplified form. This form was filled out and returned. On 25 January, 1943, a Site Board visited the college to inspect its facilities. This board was composed of the following members: Lt. Claude L. Duke, Jr., Chairman, and Lt. Garland H. Holloman, representa-

tives of the Army Air Forces Southeast Training Center, Maxwell Field, Alabama, Mr. Lawrence K. Hayes, representative of the U. S. Engineers, Ohio River Division, Columbus, Ohio. The Centre College representatives who met with this Site Board were: Dr. James H. Hewlett, Herbert A. Meyer, Business Manager, and J. H. Biles, professor of mathematics. The report of this Site Board stated that Centre College "would be receptive to a student program and would be willing, subject to approval by their Board of Trustees, to enter into a contract with the United States Government to provide necessary housing, messing, recreational, and classroom facilities for approximately 450 students. Dormitories and classroom buildings were inspected at Centre College and found to be adequate in size and construction and offered all necessary facilities for the proper conduction of a proposed school." This report further stated that "It is deemed advisable by the



college representatives to turn over the entire men's college at Centre to the Army and in turn their remaining male students would be taken care of in conjunction with the women's college of Centre College."

On 19 February 1943, the college received from the Army Air Forces, Headquarters of the Materiel Command, Washington, D. C., a LETTER OF INTENT which stated that the institution had been selected for the training of approximately 450 trainees, the first 200 to arrive on or about 1 March 1943. It stated further that a Site Planning Committee would visit the college to study requirements of the training program, on the basis of which a formal contract would be prepared authorizing payment for services and facilities, the expenditures under this contract not to exceed \$94,500.00 in the aggregate without further written authorization from the Contracting officer. This Letter of Intent was accepted under the date of 24 February 1943 by Dr. Hewlett who had been authorized by the Board of Trustees to contract with the government for a unit of students for training in the Army Air Corps.

On 18 February 1943, Captain Howard Earl Robertson and a staff of officers and enlisted men arrived to take command of the unit and office facilities were provided for them on the second floor of Old Centre and served as headquarters for the detachment. The Medical Officer, Cap-





tain Harry T. Wilson, Jr., arrived on 25 February and on the night of 28 February the first group of 200 trainees arrived from Miami Beach. General Order No. 25, Headquarters, AAFSETO, Maxwell Field, Alabama, designated the unit as the 20th College Training Detachment (Aircr.

On 1 April 1943, 250 more trainees arrived from Miami and the full contingent has been on the campus most of the time since that date. The students are enlisted men, completely uniformed. During the course of training here, a number of groups of students have been received which were composed of men with previous military service. Many of these were non-commissioned officers up to and including the grade of master sergeant. After September, 1943, the men were younger and very few had had previous service; however, all had completed basic training. All trainees are scheduled to remain at the detachment for a period of five months after which they are scheduled to be sent to classification center for classification. The group that reported in November were the first who had been classified at the Basic Training Center and as of 1 March 1944 only 86 unclassified students were in the detachment.

All students are placed on orders during their last scheduled month to participate in regular and frequent aerial flights. This flight instruction is given at Goodall Field, under the provisions of the contract between Claude Aiken, lessee, and the Government. This contract is in-

dependent of the one between the Government and Centre College.


Very soon after Centre College was notified in February that the detachment would be established, the college received a proposed curriculum, Flight Table E, which was set up. This schedule provided for 464 hours of instruction per man but was further amplified before 1 March 1943 by the addition of 20 hours in medical aid.


When the commanding officer arrived on 18 February and a number of meetings were held with him, the college set up the initial organization for the academic instruction of the detachment. This first organization provided for the prescribed 484 hours of work to be covered in a period of twenty weeks. Up until this time no information had been received as to the manner of student flow in and out of the detachment. However, on 1 March, 200 men were placed in school fully equipped with text books.

About the middle of March, a new directive, T. C. Memorandum 50-25-1, dated 24 February 1943, was received, which described in detail the manner in which the work should be done and which furnished an outline of what


might be expected in the matter of flow of men into and out of the detachment. On 1 April 1943, after having received 250 more men, the detachment was organized into five quintiles of 90 men each. Each quintile was further subdivided into two groups of 45 men each for attendance in class and for administrative purposes. This organization has continued to the present time. If, however, the Air Corps student were to take the entire course of study and at the same time have the one hour per day of supervised study, which the directive required, and also the one hour per day of physical training and one hour per day of military drill, compliance with a requirement of a maximum of nine hours per day of scheduled activity was impossible. Several schemes for trying to meet these conditions were tried. None were completely successful. Another uncertainty, which has never definitely been cleared up, was inclusion in the course of study of certain "electives." After consultation with the Commanding Officer, it was agreed that the "electives" set up should be navigation and meteorology. These courses were taught on the civilian pilot training level from the text prepared for that

purpose. The chief reasons for the selection of these two subjects for the "electives" were that the content of the material was of immediate value and that these two subjects fitted into our particular manpower arrangement better than any other combinations which we could find. Another condition which lowered the efficiency of the work of the teachers, particularly in the early months, was the call for men to be sent to the classification center at intervals not in the normal arrangement or in the normal flow numbers. The consequent necessity of filling their places by men sent up from the lower classes disrupted an orderly teaching process from the top flight to the bottom. A smaller difficulty of the same nature occurred when a man left the detachment before the regular time to go to the classification center. The statement is made to emphasize the fact that a somewhat better job could have been done if the conditions had approached more nearly to the ideal set up as stated in the plans.

Any account of the history of the detachment would be incomplete without some estimate of the boys themselves, their capacities, their habits, their adjustments to circumstances, and their achievement. The students have been of markedly superior physique. None of the officers and men have ever stood before a group, day after day, and month after month, of such fine-looking and clean-cut boys as have been here for the past year. Their mental capacity has been equal to or perhaps better than that of the boys who attended the college in the past. What is even more important probably is that their motivation has been of a much higher order than that of the normal student. All of these factors have made the experience of teaching them a pleasure to all the faculty. In the community the general judgment from the beginning has been that these are a good-looking group and on the whole conduct themselves like gentlemen.

In regard to scholastic preparation and previous education, the gamut has been run from a man who had left school at the end of the seventh grade to a man who had a year of graduate work at a large university. Between these two extremes have been men at every stage, including one man who was a graduate of an engineering school. In age they have extended from boys scarcely away from their mothers to men barely under the top age limit; previous military experience from only a few weeks in basic training to men with six years in the "Old Army"; in poise and command, from men who could lead a regiment to others who by no stretch of the imagination should have been here at all. Fortunately, there have not been many of the latter description. The younger ones are better prepared for the work; the older ones are more alive to the need of the instruction.

How well has the academic job which was set up been

done? In the very nature of things, an accurate measurement is impossible. There have been some very encouraging statements from the boys who have been trained here, such as the following:

"Passing grade in Math at Maxwell Field is 70, but I am averaging 100."

"I rode through to my wings on your navigation."

"Maps and charts are a breeze after the geography we got at the 20th College Training Detachment."

"I was never a fellow who thought much about history, but your history course has made me like to read it and I believe that I shall continue to keep it up."

"I never was able to get on my feet and talk but now I think it is fun."

"I got more real education in three and one-half months at the 20th College Training Detachment than in two and one-half years at Blank College."

"You have done more to make a man out of my boy in four months than his mother and I have been able to do in twenty years."

All in all, about eleven hundred letters have been received from boys who have taken their training here telling

about their experiences and sometimes making very helpful suggestions for the improvement of the work. Some who have had leaves have spent them here. Two who have received their wings have been back and talked at a meeting of the detachment. The report which they made to the boys of the present detachment has had a pronounced and immediate effect upon the attitude of the boys in the school and, therefore, has been very helpful.

Every teacher has been impressed with the achievement which can be made when the motivation of a student is high and when the teacher has exerted a greater effort than usual in the organization and in the presentation of his material. It is interesting to note that the achievement of several men of only eighth grade preparation has been exceptional. Every teacher who had participated in the program will go back to his work in civilian life improved in the technique of instruction, more insistent in his demand for discipline and order in the classroom, more competent in securing discipline and orderliness—in brief, he will go back to his work a much better teacher than he was before. Educators and school administrators could well study the methods and the techniques which have been used in the





College Training Detachment program. Undoubtedly much significant data could be derived from such a study which could be used in the educational planning of the future.

PHYSICAL TRAINING

The following is a statement of the physical training program.

It is the purpose of the physical training department to plan and execute a program designed to prepare the trainee for the pre-flight program. It is not the purpose of this

department to advance the trainee beyond this point. With this thought as the basic for planning our training program, the director of physical training was sent to the classification center at Nashville, Tennessee, twice in order to observe the work done there. Captain Jess Thomas and Lieutenant Krause were very helpful in assisting the director in outlining the program, and putting it into operation. Lieutenant Kurachek of the physical training department at Maxwell Field spent two days at Centre assisting us in

advancing our program and also while here he helped in laying out the first cross country.

1. In order to carry out the plans of this program:

a. The trainee is required to participate for a minimum of one hour per day, for six days a week in the regularly scheduled physical training classes. In addition, he has the opportunity to participate in regularly scheduled inter-flight contests.

b. Adequate facilities, areas and equipment have been provided. These include the entire facilities of the gym, two out-door basketball courts, four volley ball courts, five softball diamonds, a half-mile obstacle course, and a half-mile track, a two-mile cross country on the college grounds, a five-mile cross country laid out on a farm owned by Centre College (this course includes many natural obstacles). When weather does not permit work on regular athletic area, the college has arranged for the use of a hard-surfaced area where calisthenics can be given and short cross country can be held. Two fields for use in giving calisthenics and wand drill. A third field for soccer, touch football, etc.

2. The physical training program includes:

a. Conditioning and hardening exercises. These include: cross country, obstacle, wind springs, grass drill, medicine ball, and double timing.

b. Mass drill includes: calisthenics, wands.

c. Games and contests include: basketball, volleyball, relays, tug-of-war, track and field, softball.

d. Individual skills: tumbling, horizontal bars, various track and field events.

e. Testing: physical fitness tests, Burpee tests (20 sec.).

f. Administration: entire program is subject to approval of the Commanding Officer and the Post Surgeon.

1. Director of physical training.

2. Assistant director of physical training.

3. Assisted by two tactical non-commissioned men of the permanent personnel.

The physical training program here follows closely General Orders No. 58, Headquarters, AAFEFTC. Changes have been made from time to time in order to conform to new directives.

The program is introduced on a graduated scale. In the conditioning exercises, the trainee gets his first work on the quarter-mile track, double timing in formation; from there he goes to the cross country on the campus. The last step is the five-mile cross country, a run which the trainee is expected to do by the time he leaves here. Very much the same practice is carried out in running the obstacle course. The more difficult obstacles are taken separately so that the trainee can be taught the proper way to jump and



how to land without injury. After this step he is allowed to run the entire course. In giving mass drills, such as calisthenics and wands, a graduated scale is used. The new trainee is drilled thoroughly in the proper execution of pre-commands. From this point the exercises given are in line with those given in the manual. Mass commands are included in this drill; the same procedure is followed in giving wand drill.


One hour each is devoted to games and contests. Each trainee has his choice of participating in basketball, volleyball, softball, tug-of-war. As little supervision as possible is given in these games. After the trainee has been familiarized with the rules of the game, the men are left to

themselves, except that the instructors are on hand to see that the rules are observed. In the case of upper classmen the amount of time given to games and contests has in some instances been extended.

Tumbling is given to the flights a month before they start their flight training. The exercises given are as outlined in the manual—forward roll, backward roll, head stand, and hand stand. Changing of batons in a given area is given to develop alertness.

The regular physical fitness tests are given at six weeks intervals.

The Post Surgeon is kept advised at all times of the program. During bad weather he is consulted daily.





HOUSING AND ADMINISTRATION

The detachment was activated on 1 March 1943, per authority of General Orders No. 25, Headquarters, Army Air Forces Southeast Training Center (now Eastern Flying Training Command), Maxwell Field, Montgomery, Alabama. Having reported to this station in compliance with paragraph 20, Special Orders No. 46, Headquarters, Army Air Forces Southeast Training Center, Captain Howard Earl Robertson assumed command. The college having made no preparation for the reception of the detachment due to the fact that only a letter of intent had been received, the commanding officer and his staff began immediate work on plans for the housing and feeding of the prospective students.

Building No. 1 had been used as the President's home and would adequately house 45 students in the event that additional shower facilities were installed. Work begun immediately converting the kitchen into a shower room.

Building No. 2 belonged to the Kentucky Alpha Delta



Chapter of Phi Delta Theta. The members of the chapter leased the building to the college who in turn leased it to the Government for housing facilities. This building also had to be remodeled to meet the specifications of the Army Air Forces and existing regulations. This building was set up to house 45 trainees. In numbering the various buildings, it was decided that Building No. 3, also a fraternity house, was not suitable for use by the detachment, but the number was retained; therefore, the number 3 is omitted from the list.

Building No. 4, called Wiseman Hall, was used by the college both as a dormitory and dining hall. This was quickly converted from a "family style" manner of feeding to a cafeteria style. The upper floor was used to house approximately 35 trainees.

Hillcrest, the college faculty home, was designated as Building No. 5. The large parlor space and the plumbing

facilities were the ideal set up for a dispensary. Captain Harry T. Wilson, Jr., Medical Officer, initiated a clean-up procedure in the building and procured the necessary equipment for complete medical care. The second floor provided sleeping quarters for 25 men.

Building No. 6, also known as Wiseman Hall, was the newest building on the post and retained its status as sleeping quarters for about 60 men.

The oldest building on the campus, "Old Centre," as it has faithfully been called for 125 years, was tagged as Building No. 7 and most of the second floor was made into offices for the detachment. Wall board partitions were installed and new desks and typewriters replaced the cobwebs of abandoned rooms.

The building that had been called Breckenridge Hall took on a new name, "Gruesome Gables." A large rambling building with lots of wasted material and space became

barracks for 190 men. Many changes had to be made to provide adequate shower and toilet facilities. This building is No. 8.

The Library, No. 9, is available for use by the students and has an adequate supply of reference material.

Probably the greatest revelation of all took place in Building No. 10, the Main Building. This had been used for class rooms for many years, and a small coffee shop was located in the basement. In 1926, wood stoves were replaced by a central heating system and electric lighting was added. The assembly hall was walled with pictures of the former presidents of the college. The back of the stage had huge windows, causing the audience to look directly into the light. It was decided that the building was adequate to care for the class rooms with the exception of the physics department. The college officials began a clean-up campaign in the basement. A post store was added, pool room, a recreation room, and additional space for the coffee shop.

The gymnasium, No. 11, had adequate shower facilities and room to house 45 students. This was in addition to the locker rooms and the gymnasium.

Young Hall, or the science building, was numbered 12 and this is used for the express purpose of teaching physics. This is adequately equipped in laboratory and classroom facilities.

Another fraternity, the Delta Kappa Epsilon, leased their building to the college. It, in turn, was designated as No. 13 and provided space for 20 Aviation trainees.

The Centre College stadium, called Farris Stadium, provides the parade ground for all retreat and other ceremonies. It is a well-kept field, with a quarter-mile cinder track and area surrounding adequate for the installation of basketball and volley ball courts. Immediately to the west side of the stadium, the practice field is used by the plans and training officer for close order drill and demonstration courses. This is sufficient for a softball diamond and a standardized obstacle course. These two fields are used exclusively for physical and military training. In addition to the field, the college farm, near the city limits of Danville, is used for the cross country runs.

Goodall Field, located approximately five miles south of Danville, was built in 1938 for the purpose of the development of private flying. It is owned by the Chamber



of Commerce of Danville and is leased to Claude Aiken, who has entered into contract with the Government to give each Aviation Trainee at least 10 hours of dual instruction. The field is rolling with scattered trees on the southern end and a knob at the northern end. The north-south length of the field is 2,700 feet and the east-west is 1,900. The northeast-southwest runway is 2,100 feet. The field has two hangars, one built after the activation of the detachment. One is used for repair and overhaul, and the other is used for storage purposes only.

The contract is entirely separate from that made by Centre College and includes, among other things, the maintenance of a crash truck and transportation to and from the field. A bus is provided for this purpose.

In conjunction with the military training, a War Room has been built in accordance with existing regulations and provides up to date information on the various theaters of operation. This is used in connection with orientation and discussions of the present theater problems.

A day room is provided for the students and access to it is granted at the discretion of the commanding officer. Wives of the students are permitted to visit during hours that will not interfere with supervised study and regularly scheduled formation.

In addition to the facilities on the post, the town of Danville offers other means of recreation. Danville is one of the oldest towns in the state and each "old-timer" spins yarns by the hour about the little Kentucky community. It is a town where the first nine State Conventions were held; the meeting place of the first Federal District Court west of the Alleghenies. Kentucky was then called the County of Kentucky under the State of Virginia. Here in Danville stands the first post office west of the Alleghenies. The population is 6,735 and is the county seat of Boyle County. It is located on the Southern Railroad and is served by the Louisville and Nashville Railroad at a distance of three miles.

Among the more famous persons that Danville claims as "favorite sons" are Dr. Ephraim McDowell, the father of ovariotomy, James G. Birney, the Absolution candidate for President in 1840, who drew enough votes from the Whig Party in New York to cause Henry Clay to lose the election, Samuel G. Burchard, who by his famous "Rum, Romanism and Rebellion" faux pas in 1884 helped to elect Cleveland, John C. Breckenridge, whose candidacy in 1860 helped to weaken the Democratic Party and insure Lincoln's election, and Theodore O'Hara, author of "Bivouac of the Dead," once lived here.






The townspeople are engaged in such industries as manufacture of Palm Beach clothes, furniture, automobile seats, a center for burley tobacco, and other small industries.



AIRCREW STUDENT TRAINING PROGRAM AND ADMINISTRATION

With a minimum of permanent personnel it was desirable to institute a modified cadet system in the detachment. Under authority of the Army Air Forces and existing regulations from the Training Command, student officers were selected by merit to exercise supervisory and corrective control to the extent necessary for purposes of instruction



and essential to the maintenance of a high standard of military training. Aviation Student David M. Russell from Lynchburg, Virginia, was named the first Group Commander. He and his staff worked faithfully with the permanent party to keep everyone "on the ball." The students were housed in eight buildings. It was necessary to have a central control point, so a student headquarters was established. Two barracks were off the main campus, the President's home and the Phi Delta House. The mess hall could only accommodate 180 students at one time. This necessitated a very close schedule of feeding which approximates one hour and ten minutes. The food is well prepared under the close supervision of a registered dietitian and with the help of civilian men and women of the city. The medical officer with the mess officer makes daily checks of the messing facilities to insure compliance with sanitary regulations.





Food handlers are all inspected for communicable diseases and the milk and water supply is checked frequently for foreign matter and chlorine residual respectively.

Students are adequately cared for in the dispensary for all minor ailments, and with the proximity of Darnall General Hospital, all major cases are promptly and efficiently treated. The dispensary has a nine-bed ward in addition to examination rooms and operates 24 hours daily.

A board of officers, known as the Academic Board, hears all cases relative to the elimination of Aviation students. Eliminations may be recommended for physical or academic deficiencies or for sub-standard traits of character. This board makes recommendation as to the disposition of Aviation students and is submitted to Headquarters, Eastern



Flying Training Command, for action. Students may request elimination by choice.

Under the supervision of the Special Services Officer, an orchestra composed entirely of Aviation students was organized and a weekly musical program is presented in the post chapel. Dances are held in the post gymnasium. The day room and lounge equipped with reading material, card tables and two pool tables is open daily, and on certain nights each week the wives and dates of the students are permitted to join them there.

Inter-flight competition in sports, basketball, volley ball, softball, etc., is supervised by the Physical Training Department. Track and field events have led to a high spirit of competition among the various flights. In addition to recognition in this field, the flights are judged on academics, drill, retreat, all formations, room inspections, and a stream-

er is awarded the best flight of the week at the Saturday review.

In all departments, frequent daily checks are made by the commanding officer and members of his staff to insure compliance with the terms of the contract. Classroom procedure is checked, the lighting and heating facilities, and overall terms of the contract. Close contact is maintained with the college officials and all discrepancies are brought to the immediate attention of the responsible party. The resident CAA supervisor has been very co-operative in the matter of maintaining the flying schedule. Little or no lost motion exists in the flight training. Adequate equipment is supplied by the contractor and the repair and maintenance of equipment is excellent. A frequent check is made as to the efficiency of each flight instructor in order to maintain the highest quality in training.

The training program is based in its entirety on the directives set forth in T. C. Memorandum No. 50-25-1, dated 25 November 1943.

FUNCTIONING OF DETACHMENT ORGANIZATION

The attainment of the objectives set forth in pertinent directives can only be measured by results; by the number of men fully trained who have departed from this station, by personal expressions from the students themselves, and by comparison of various quintiles.

Inasmuch as this phase of training was a new experiment of the Air Corps, many problems were to be expected; some major, many minor. Probably the greatest problem has been in maintaining academic, physical, military and flying schedule. Difficulties involved in this were caused by various things. First of all, the selection of men for the initial quintiles. Next, the disruption of the regularly scheduled program due to the irregular shipments as indicated in the flow chart.

In the organization of the detachment some major problems were encountered because the college was not prepared to receive the personnel. Beds had been ordered

but shipment was not made in time to meet the needs. This was solved by borrowing from Darnell General Hospital and Jeffersonville Quartermaster Depot. The mess was family style which was not too bad for only 200 men here during March, but it was a battle against time to get cafeteria equipment installed by the time of the April shipment.

The shower and toilet facilities, minor building repair, etc., were rushed into construction.

The college experienced difficulties with priorities. However, by the time the full quota was reached the physical plant was functioning almost normally. The flying contractor had not experienced the difficulty that the college had felt. They were ready to begin the flying training on schedule.

The detachment had been very fortunate in the matter of personnel. The students have had exceptionally good health. Only one epidemic has marred its record. That (mumps) was so slight that no time was lost through quarantine.

The administration has functioned exceedingly well. The results of inspections in this department have been very gratifying.



SUPPLEMENTAL HISTORY—I MARCH 1944-

I MAY 1944

The first few days of March were spent in normal routine. Flying schedules were maintained with some interruptions caused by weather conditions. On 4 March, 90 unclassified Aviation students were transferred to San Antonio Aviation Cadet Center. This was the first group of graduates to be transferred from the Eastern Flying Training Command.

On 12 March, 91 Aviation trainees were transferred from the "A" Pool at Freeman Field, Seymour, Indiana, and on 18 March and 21 March, another graduating class was transferred. This group concluded the unclassified students, and eight of the class, being previously classified, were

transferred to Courtland Army Air Base, Courtland, Alabama, for On-the-Line training awaiting entrance into Pre-Flight.


On 1 April 1944, the Associated Press released a wire to the local newspaper stating that the detachment at Centre College would be terminated on 30 June 1944. This news article caused considerable comment by local citizens and the detachment officials were queried as to the status of the detachment. However, after receiving no comment from the detachment personnel the rumors were quelled.

On 3 April 1944, the Headquarters received a message-form from the Eastern Flying Training Command to the effect that former Army Ground Forces, Army Service Forces, and Volunteer Flying Trainees would be relieved from Aircrew training without prejudice for the convenience of the Government.

At 1300 on 3 April 1944, the Army Ground Force and Army Service Force personnel were assembled and informed of the facts outlined in the basic TWX. Immediately following this formation, the Volunteer Flying Trainees were assembled and orientated in the same manner.

This announcement had the anticipated results. The men who were in the three categories were outstanding students for the most part and this announcement struck a severe blow.


On 10 April, the 23 Volunteer Flying Trainees were transferred to Scott Field, Illinois. Prior to their departure,

however, the Commanding Officer and his staff exerted special efforts to boost the morale of these students. On 16 April, 50 former Army Ground Force and Army Service Force men were transferred in grade to Fort Francis E. Warren, Wyoming, and on 19 April, 28 such men were transferred to the 78th Infantry Division, Camp Pickett, Virginia. These were also given special attention prior to their departure. (See letter, this Headquarters, Subject: "Entertainment for Men Relieved from Aircrew Training." File No. 353, dated 20 April 1944.)

The second group of students from an "A" pool reported for duty at this station 18 April from Freeman Field. This group consisted of 114 trainees. During the remainder of the month, 135 trainees were transferred to this station, making a total of 249 April enrollees.

On 22 April, 88 graduates were transferred from this station to Pre-Flight School, Maxwell Field, Alabama.

Instructions from Headquarters, Army Air Forces Eastern

Flying Training Command, Subject: "Instructions for Operating CTD's, May and June 1944, File No. 353.11, dated 20 April 1944," necessitated changes in the routine courses of academic instruction and in flight instruction. Through the college faculty co-ordinator a new program was arranged to meet the changes in training plans. According to instructions contained in this letter, flying for April enrollees had to be pro-rated not to exceed quotas set up by the CAA. These regulations stated that the only authorized quota plus 25 per cent could be flown during the period of one month; consequently approximately 75 students will not be subjected to flying training.

The 20th College Training Detachment (Aircrew) was disbanded as of 2359, 30 April 1944, per authority contained in General Orders No. 30, Headquarters, Eastern Flying Training Command, and in its stead the 2171st AAF Base Unit (College Training, Aircrew), was organized 0001, 1 May 1944.



SUPPLEMENTAL HISTORY— MAY 1944- 25 JULY 1944

On 25 May 1944, 90 Aviation students, having completed training at this detachment, were transferred to Spence Field, Moultrie, Georgia, to enter On-the-Line training.

The commissioned personnel and all Aviation students of the detachment participated in the Memorial Day parade from Centre College to the Danville Cemetery, where the ceremony was conducted, and then returned to the college.

This Headquarters received General Order No. 28, Headquarters, Army Air Forces Training Command, Ft. Worth, Texas, dated 9 June 1944, designating 25 July 1944 as the date this detachment is scheduled to inactivate.

On Sunday, 25 June 1944, at 1630, the final review was conducted in Farris Stadium. The mayor of Danville, Centre College president, and other officials, together with the officers of the detachment, were present in the reviewing stand. Approximately 500 residents of Danville and vicinity attended the ceremony.

At 1200, 26 June 1944, flight training was discontinued completing 11,373 hours and 10 minutes.

At 1600, 26 June 1944, all academic activities were discontinued.

On 28 June 1944, 62 Aviation students were transferred to Blytheville Army Air Field, Blytheville, Arkansas, four were transferred to Courtland, Alabama, and the balance of 229 were transferred to Greenwood Army Air Field, Greenwood, Mississippi.





Upon the discontinuance of training and the subsequent shipment of all Aviation students, the permanent party personnel were transferred on the dates as indicated:

Medical Department enlisted men transferred 29 June 1944.

Capt. Harry T. Wilson, Jr., Medical Officer, transferred 1 July 1944.

1st Lt. C. H. Perry transferred 4 July 1944.

2nd Lt. Ralph J. Pucci transferred 4 July 1944.

Sgt. Clabby, Sgt. Carlton, Sgt. Griffin, Cpl. Herrmann, Cpl. Short, and Pfc. Reprogle transferred 16 July 1944.

Major A. B. Caine, 1st Lt. C. E. Spurgeon, T/Sgt. Alan G. Burns, and Cpl. Smith remained on duty at this station to complete final inactivation, including disposition of all Government issued property, disposition of records, etc. Property accountability was transferred to ASTP property officer, Headquarters, Fifth Service Command, Ft. Hayes, Columbus, Ohio, 17 July 1944. Sgt. Burns and Cpl. Smith transferred to Greenville Army Air Field, Greenville, Mississippi, and were placed on detached service at this station 17 July 1944. Major Caine transferred to Smyrna Army Air Field, Smyrna, Tennessee, and 1st Lt. C. E. Spurgeon transferred to Laredo Army Air Field, Laredo, Texas. Effective date of transfer 25 July 1944, but both officers remaining on detached service at the detachment until relieved by TWX from Maxwell Field, Alabama.

Pursuant to General Orders No. 28, Headquarters, Army Air Forces Training Command, Ft. Worth, Texas, dated 9 June 1944, the detachment disbanded effective 25 July 1944.
