


I will know these people forever.

And to know this place once is to know it forever.

















Homecoming







The Prime Of Miss Jean Brodie




Ex Astris






Harry Chapin








Oktoberfest




Dance-A-Thon

























Football






Cross Country











Soccer


Women's Track

The department also acquired a new \$13,000 NMR (nuclear magnetic resonance) Spectrometer with which to observe hydrogen atoms in organic molecules.














The People — A Lifestyle
