To the Class of 1964:

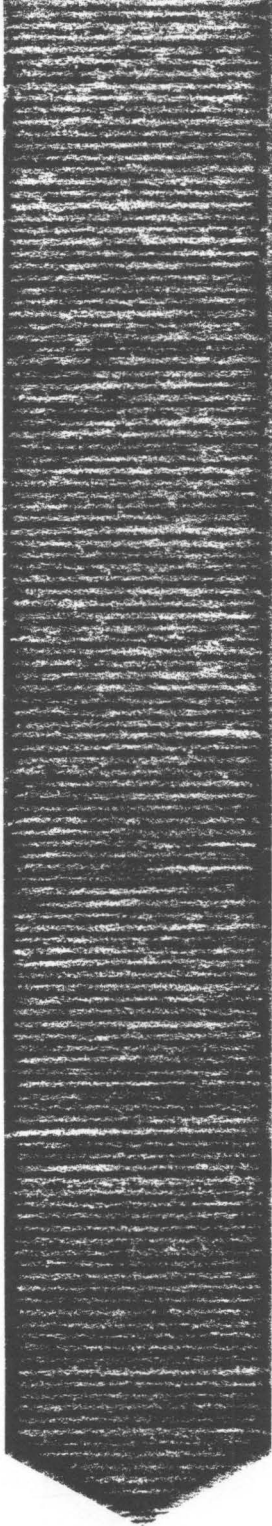

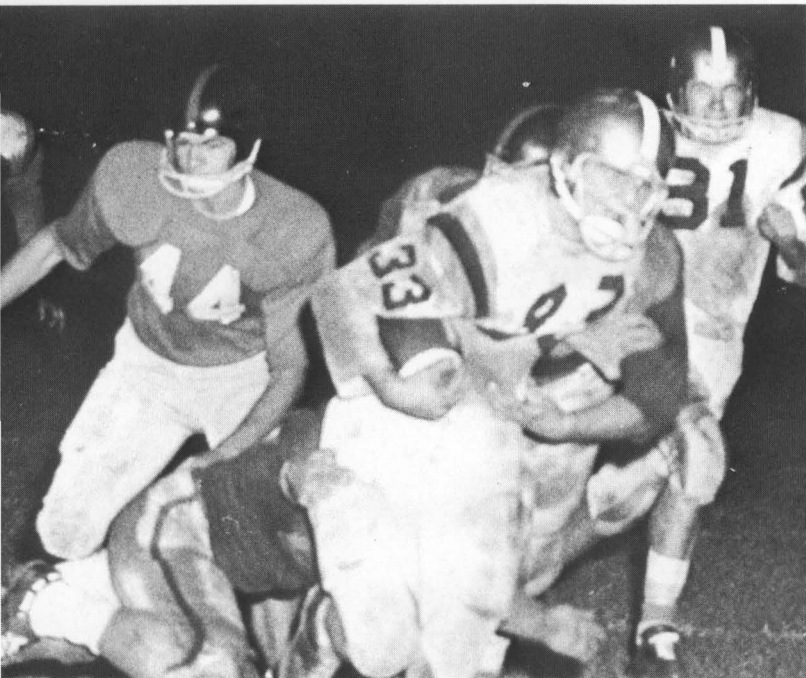


Elmer Jackson breaks loose for a gain.

Under the guidance of a new coaching staff, the Colonels opened the 1963 season at Maryville on a rainy Saturday. We lost in a tough battle, but returned in our next game, and beat Southwestern for our first C.A.C. victory. We lost the next three games. Improvement began to show as we beat Randolph-Macon, lost a close one to Hampden-Sydney and then trounced on Hanover in our final game.

The Colonels were lead this year under the leadership of co-captains, Elmer Jackson and Tom Taylor. In individual rushing Ben Hinson gained 315 yds. (3.9 avg.), Tom Isaacs, 193 yds. The team of 1963 was young team, and it improved with every game. We look forward to the Colonels of 1964.



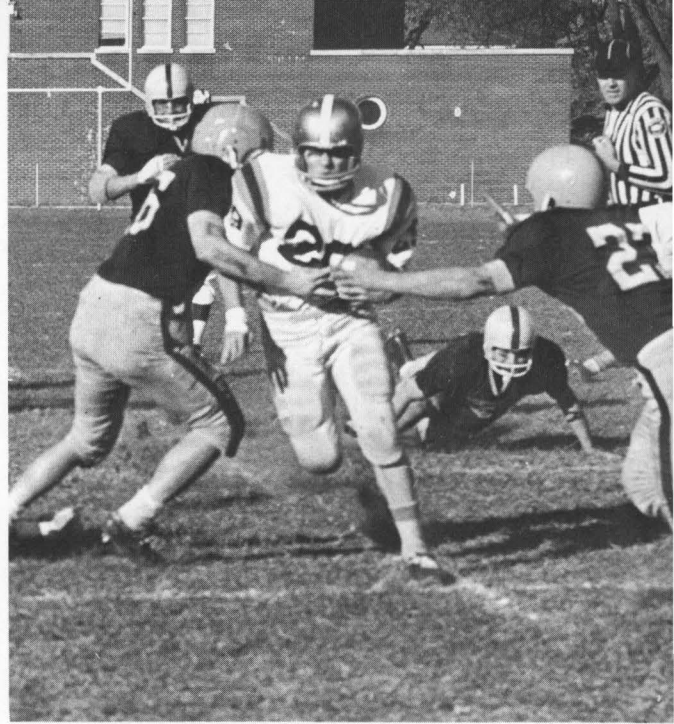

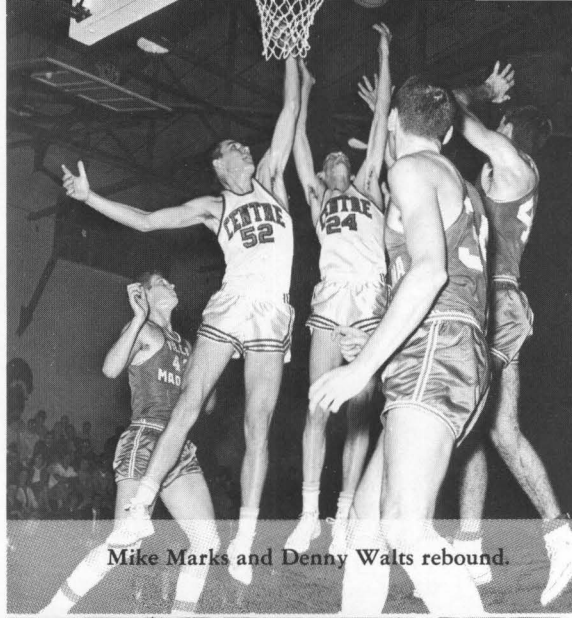
