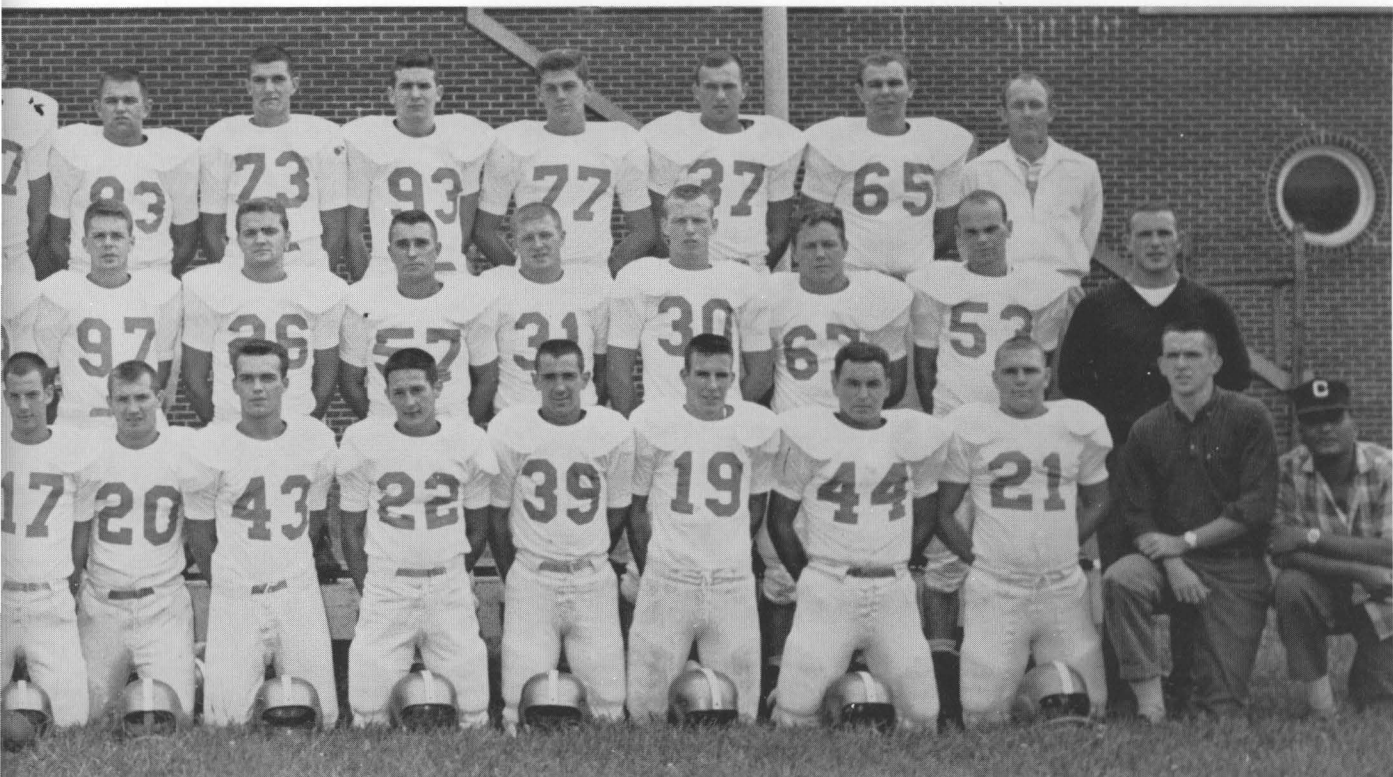
Renewing their rivalry with Washington and Lee University the Colonels dumped the Generals 7-6.

Homecoming provided the largest crowd and the best game of the year. For over three quarters Centre and Sewanee battled to a scoreless tie. With two

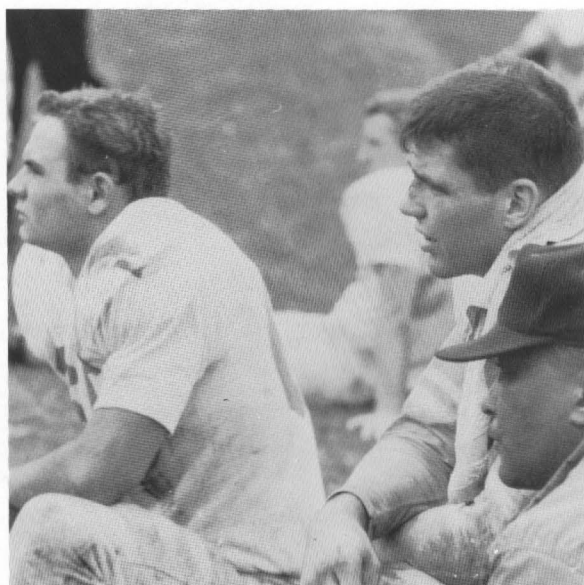

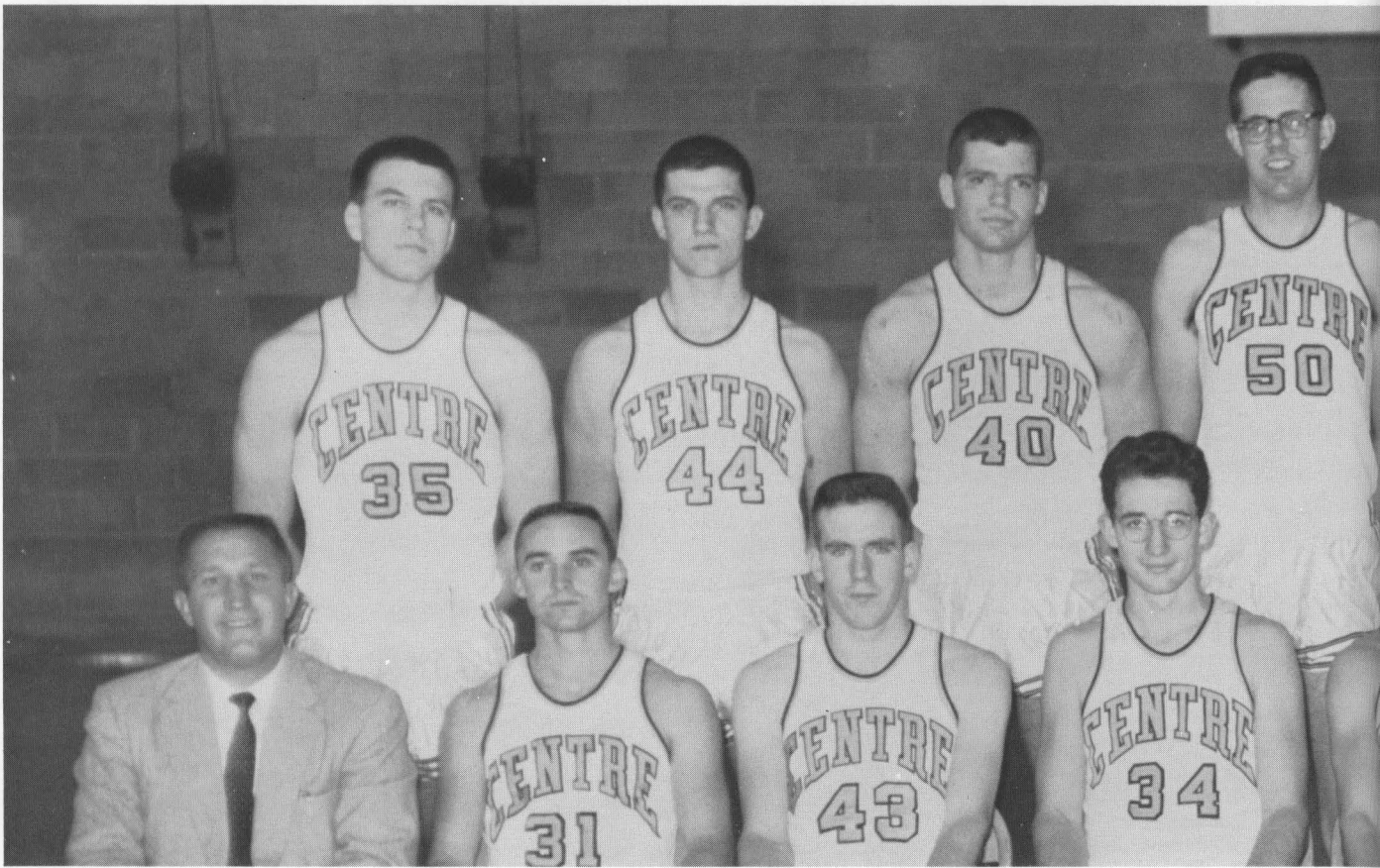

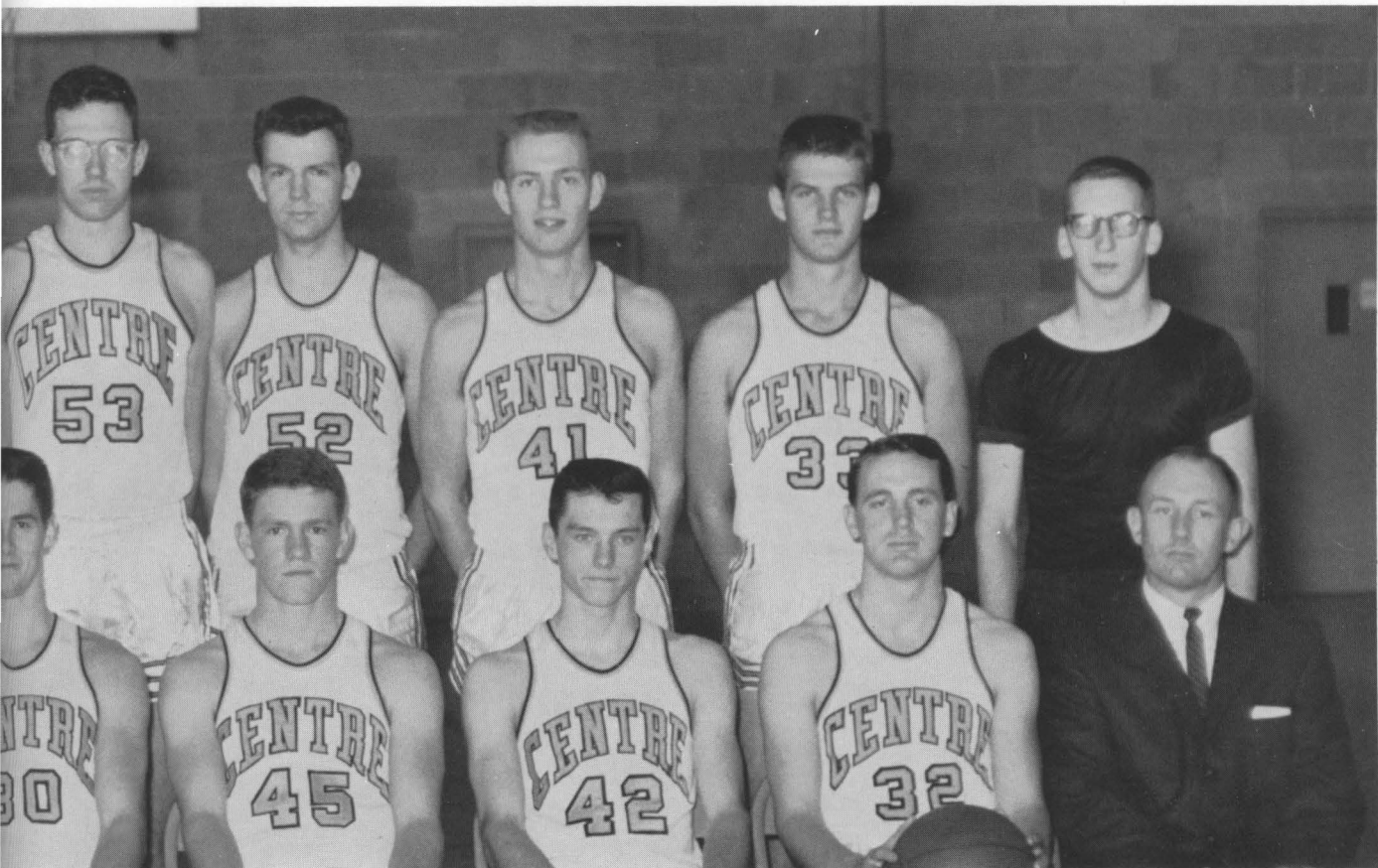
Centre's Colonels opened the 1957-58 basketball season with several untried players in key positions and a hope to improve on their 1956-57 record.

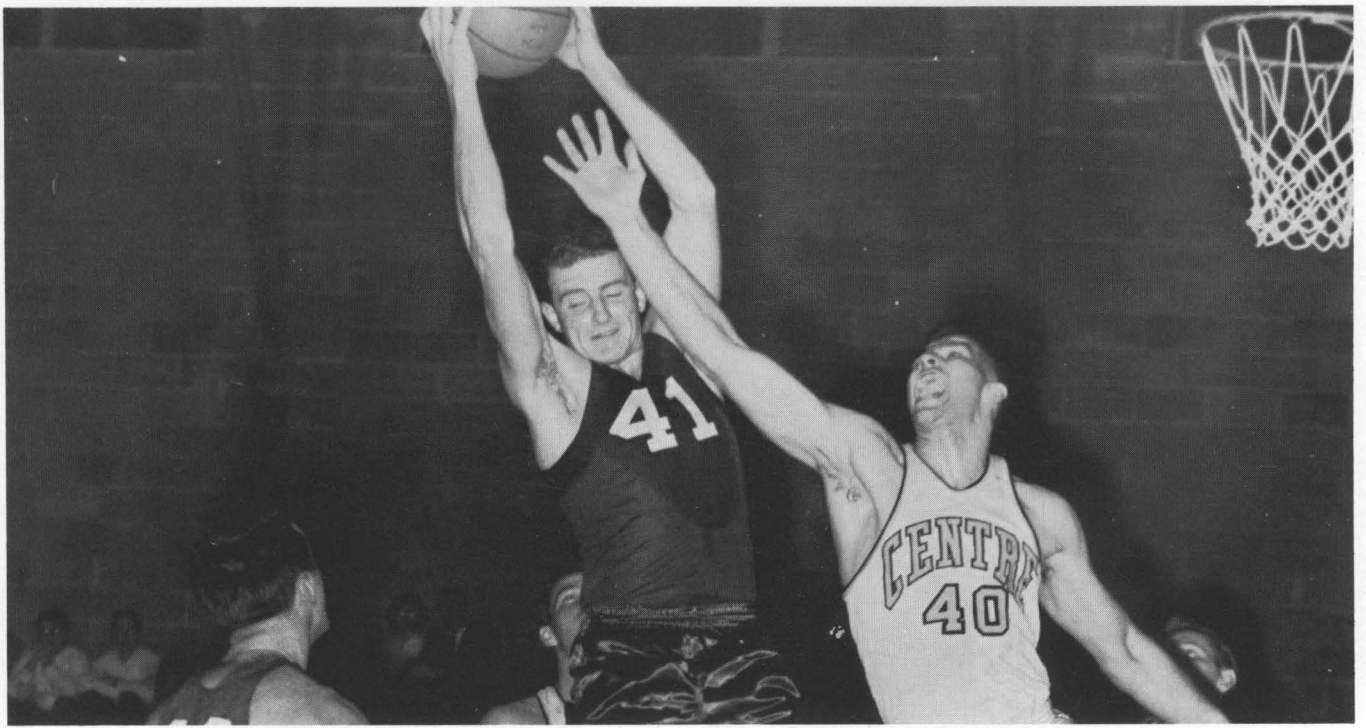

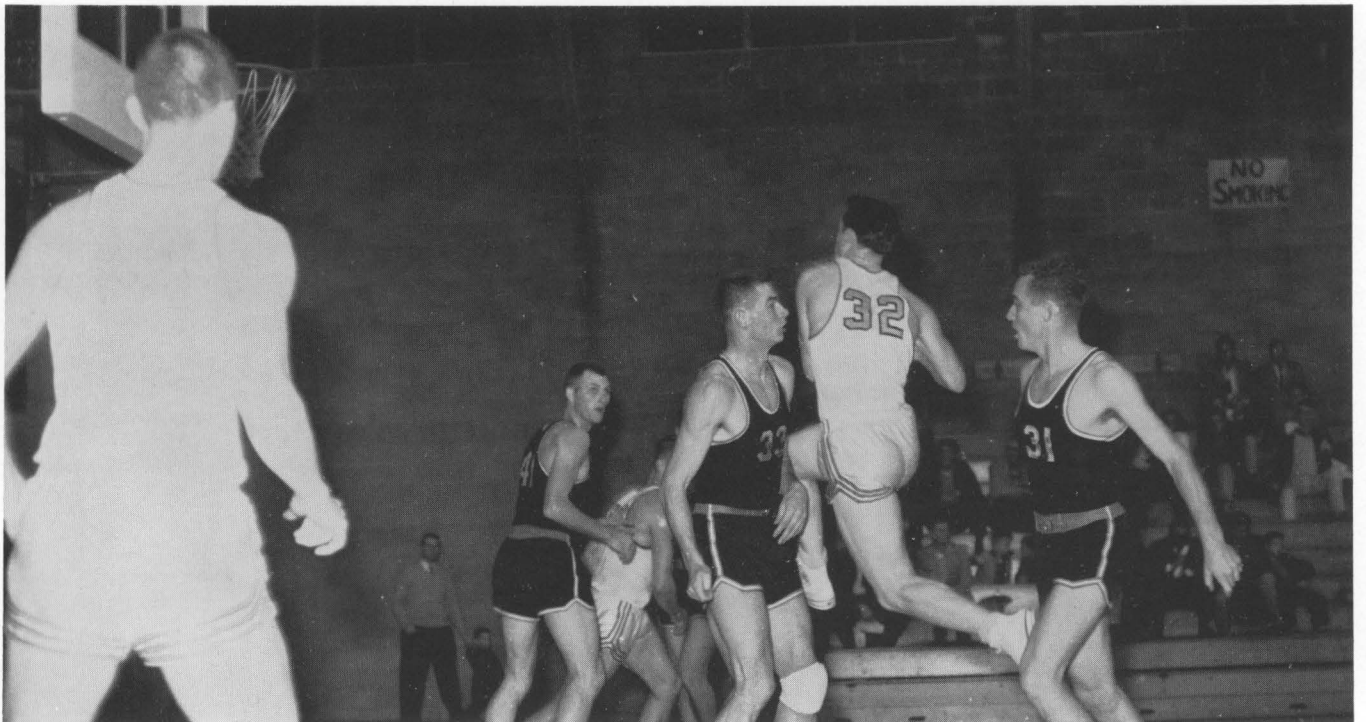
year.

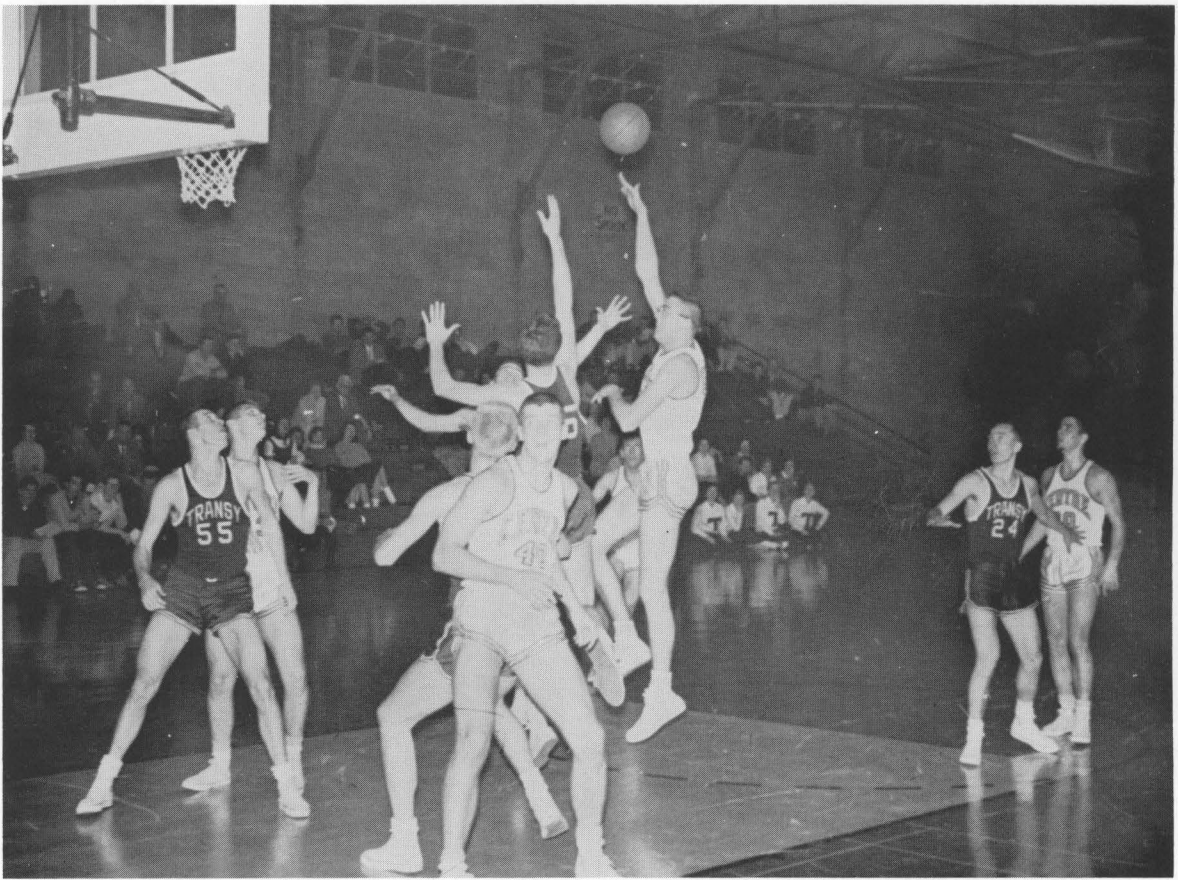

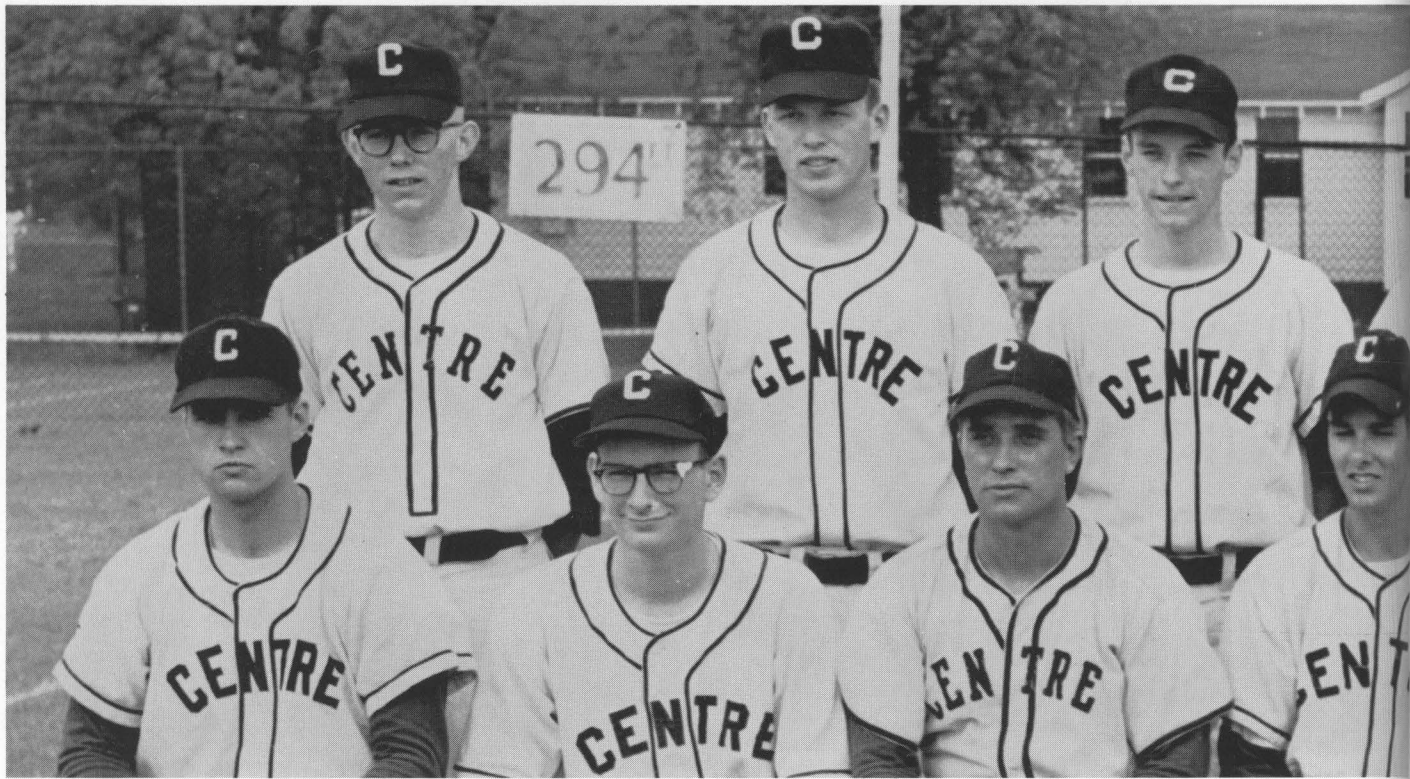

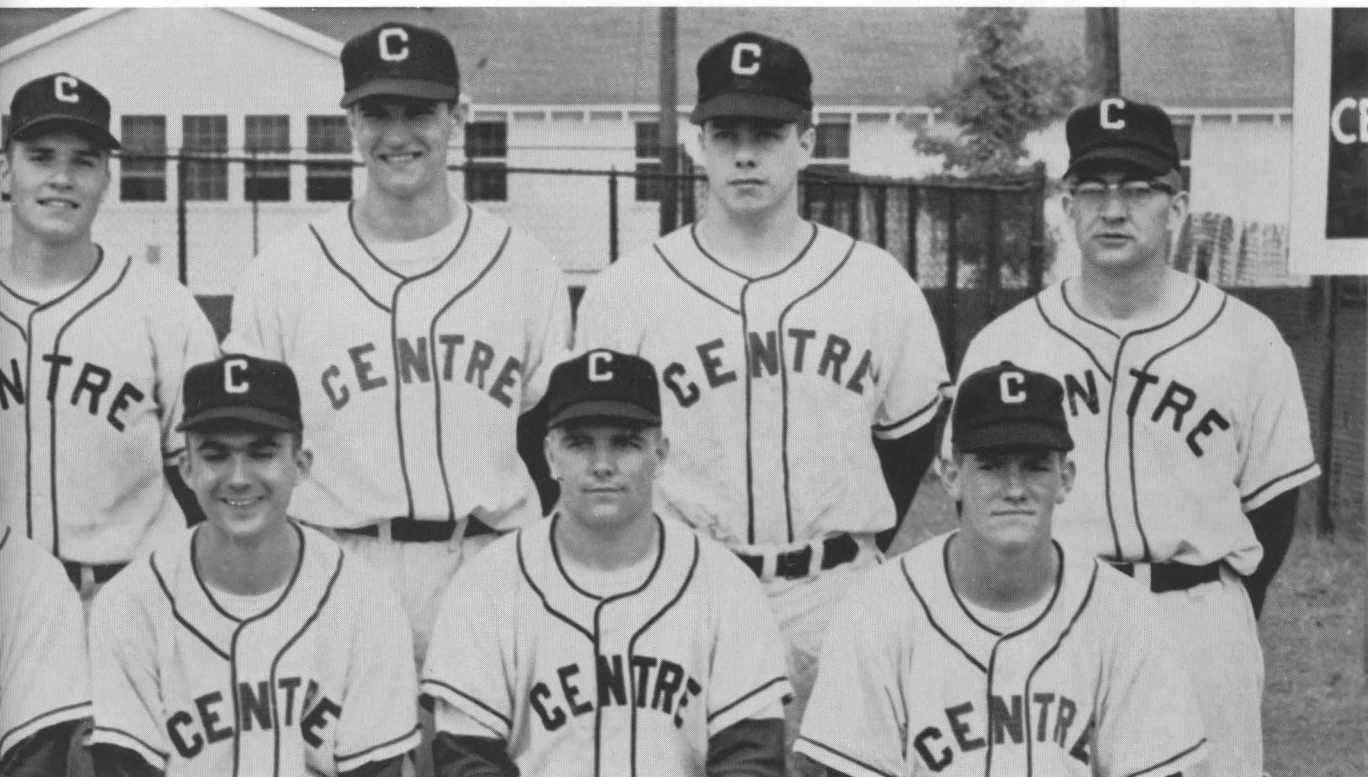

With only Fred Stern graduating Centre's prospects for the coming year seem very bright. It looks as if the Colonel baseballers could well be the most improved team in the conference in the future.

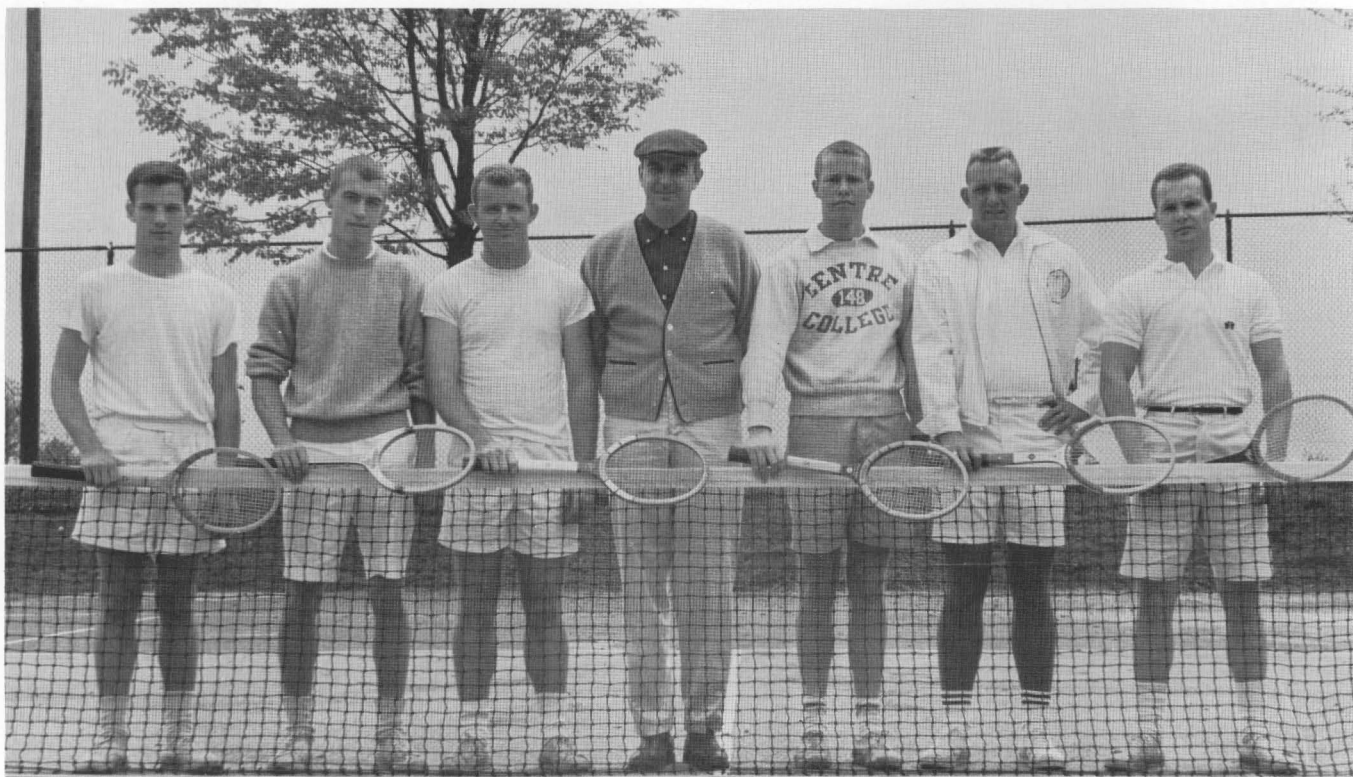

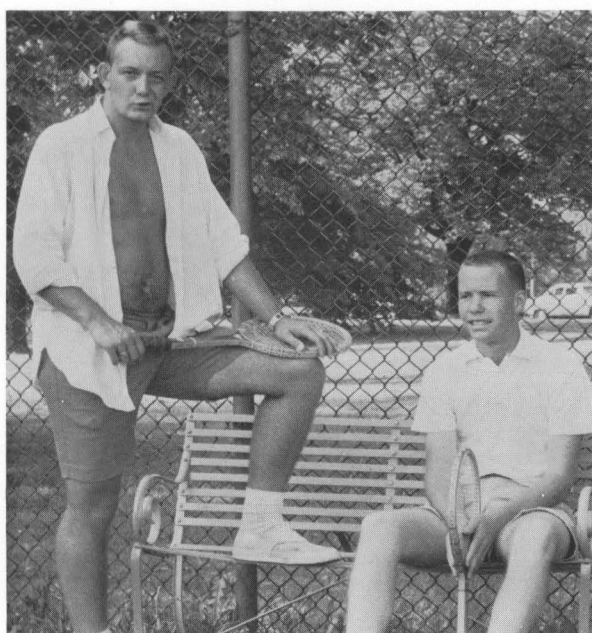

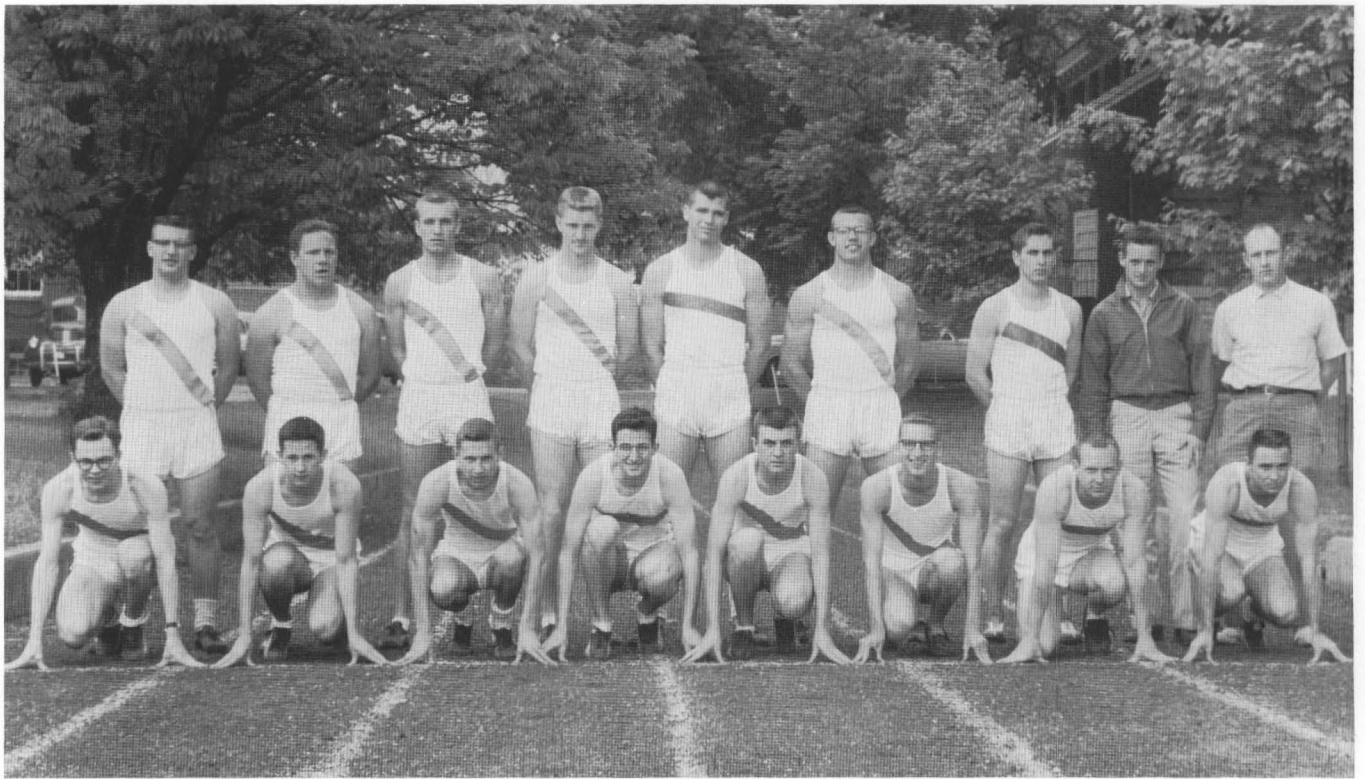

Centre boasted the best all-around track man in the conference in Dave Grissom. Grissom was highest point man in the conference meet for the second consecutive year.

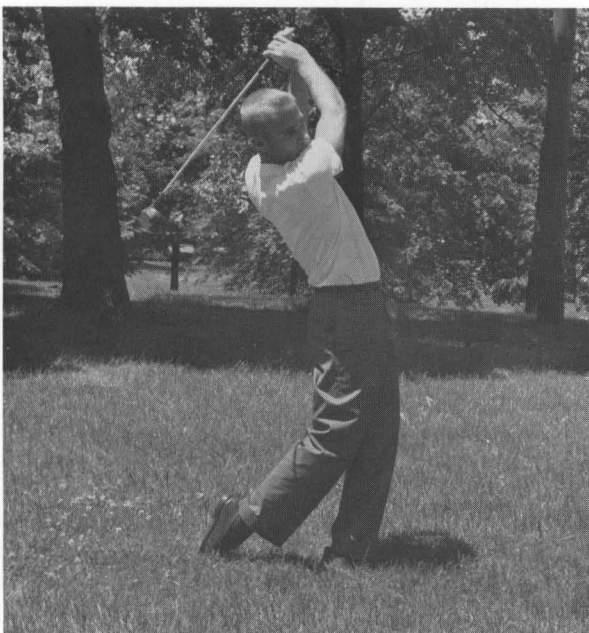
