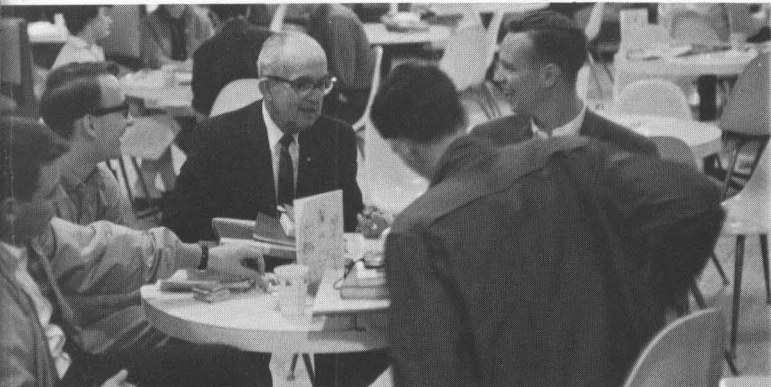
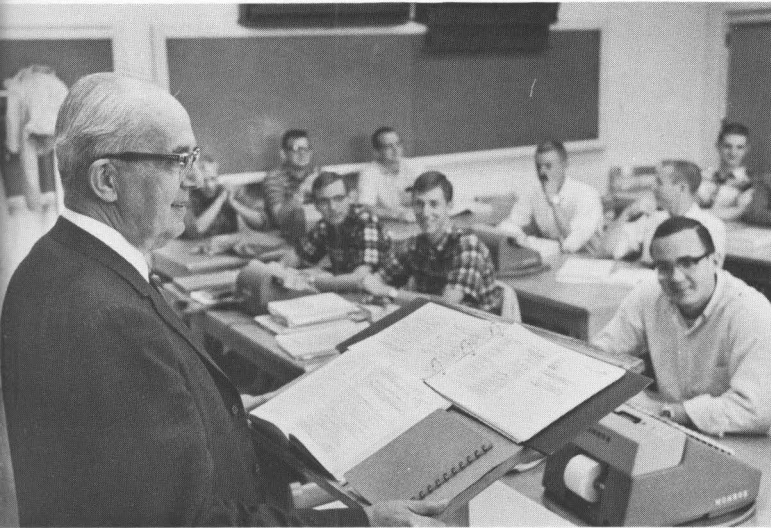
Dr. Clarence E. Heffelfinger

For four years, Dr. Heffelfinger served as acting dean of men at Centre. He is a member of Omicron Delta Kappa and was secretary of the Centre circle. The National Council of ODK has awarded him a certificate of merit for his outstanding work and service to the organization.

As sponsor of the Accounting Club and as advisor to Business Administration majors, Dr. Heffelfinger has helped many Centre students to successful careers in banking, industry, and accounting.

Gov. Combs commissioned Dr. Heffelfinger a Kentucky Colonel on March 20, 1963. The Phi Delta Thetas presented Dr. Heffelfinger with a special certificate expressing their appreciation for his services to the fraternity.

DEDICATION



The editors and staff dedicate this year's **Olde Centre** to Dr. Clarence E. Heffelfinger, who retired in June as Professor Emeritus. He had served on the Centre faculty for twenty-one years. Before coming to Centre, he taught at the University of Nanking, China and at Washington and Jefferson College, and worked for the U.S. Department of Commerce in Japan, China, and India.

Dr. Heffelfinger was graduated from Ursinus College in 1920 and later completed four years of graduate work at Columbia University. In 1951, Ursinus College awarded him the honorary degree of Doctor of Letters.

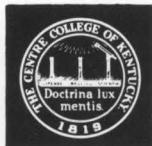

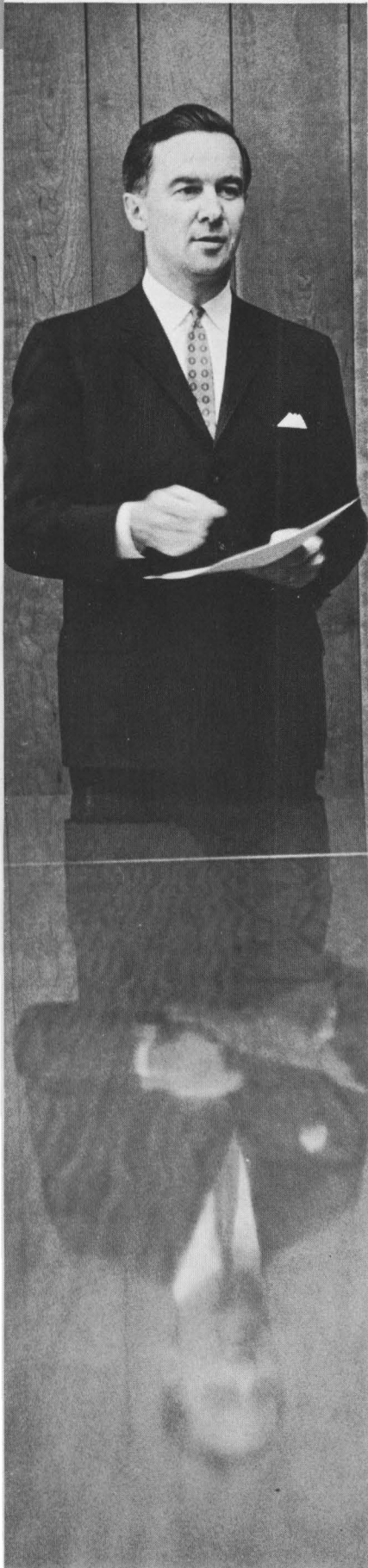

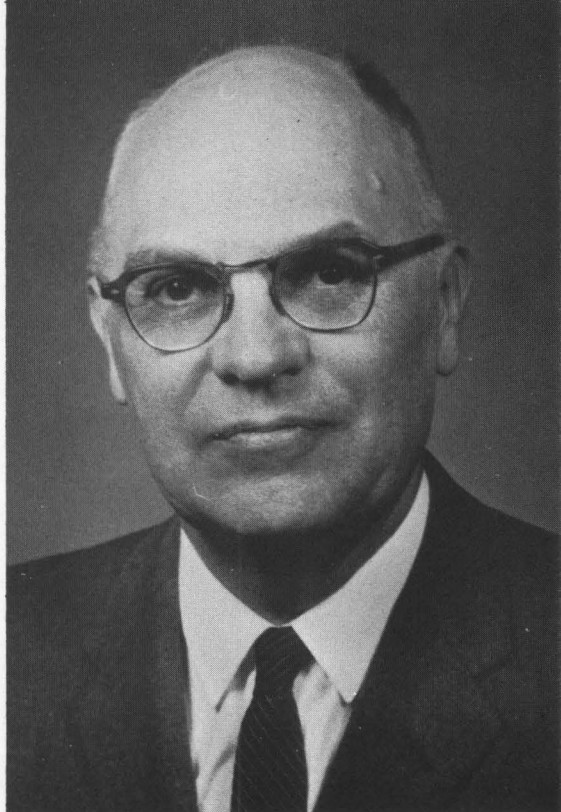
To the Class of 1963

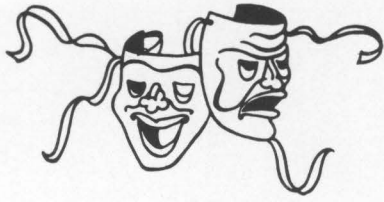

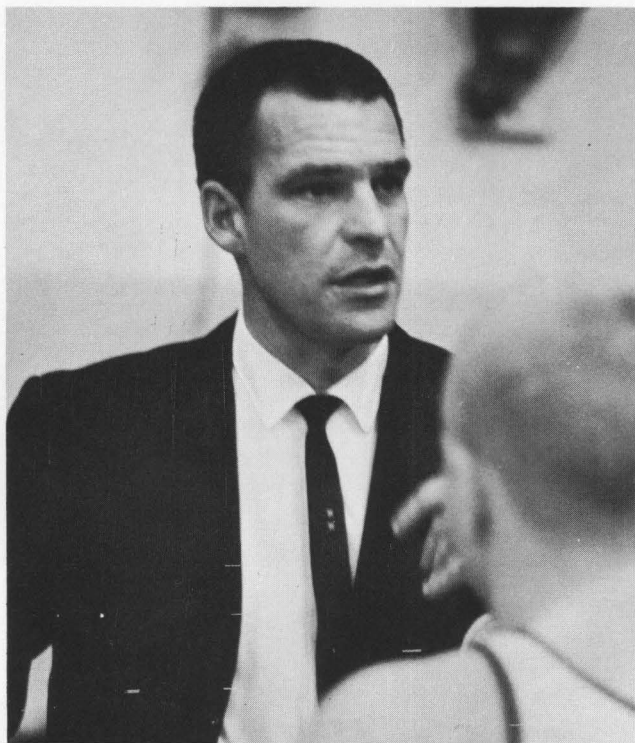

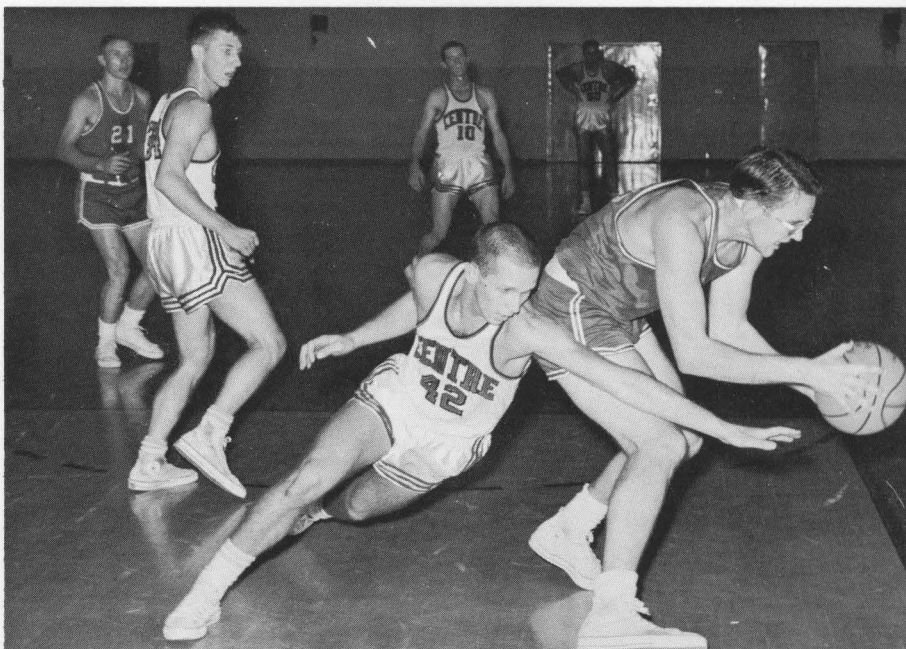

Junior Hal Smith totalled 257 points for the best record of the season. Smith also holds the team record for rebounds and minutes played.

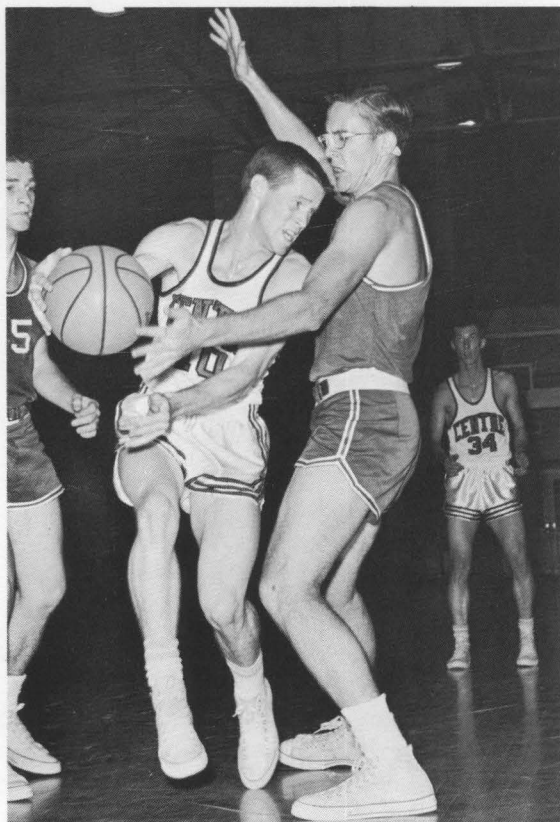
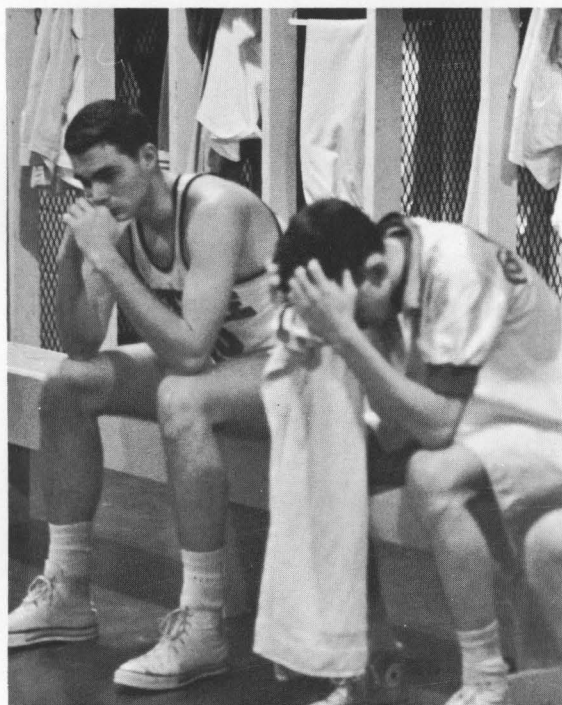

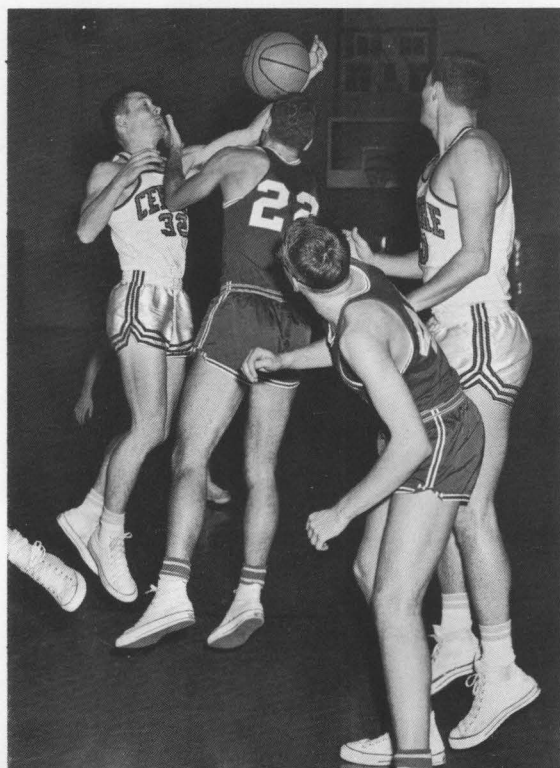

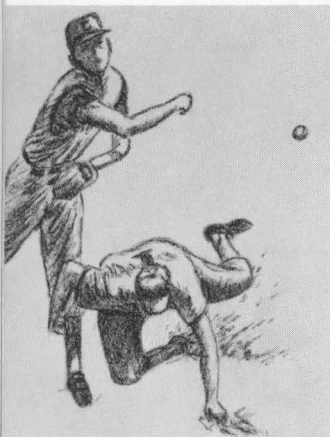

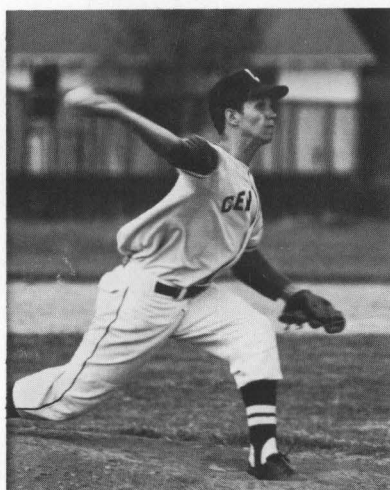

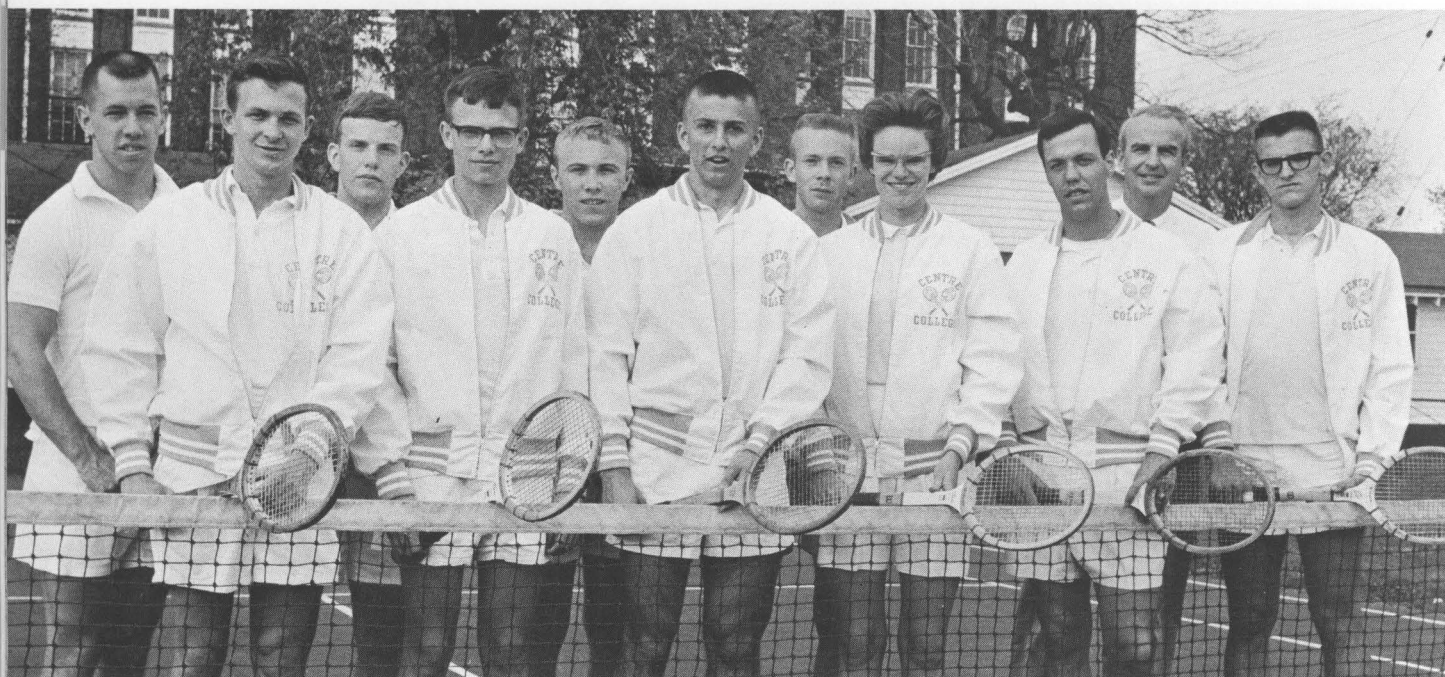
The season included seventeen games. The Colonels record was seven wins and nine losses. The team's biggest weakness proved to be a lack of hitting power.
