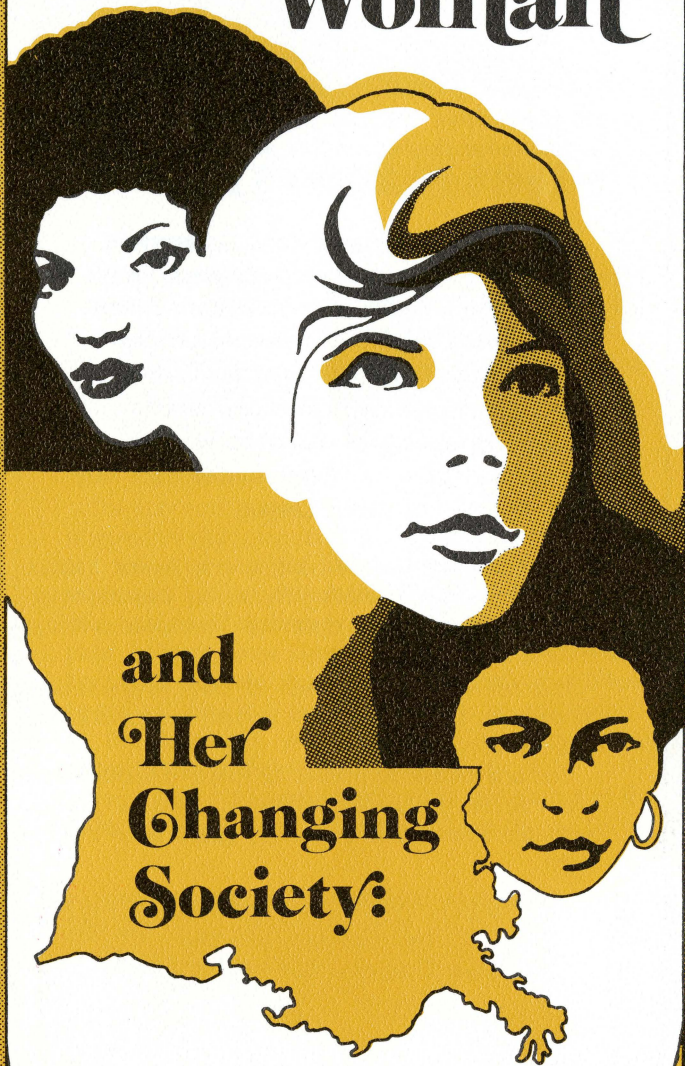

Introduction

"The Louisiana Woman and Her Changing Society" has been funded by the Louisiana Committee on the Humanities (LCH), the state-based organization of the National Endowment for the Humanities. The major purpose of programs funded by LCH is to examine timely local issues and problems from a humanistic viewpoint, in order to complement an often heavily scientific approach to problem-solving.

The sponsors of this program thought that the issue of women's changing position in society could well use the balanced insights of the humanities. The contemporary Louisiana woman, black or white, has been shaped by laws, customs, cultural traditions, as well as color, religious and class distinctions. The sponsors hope that a careful, humanistic examination of these forces will show how they have functioned with regard to the Louisiana woman and where they have benefitted or failed her and her society.

Participants are urged to attend all five programs in order to derive maximum benefit from the series.

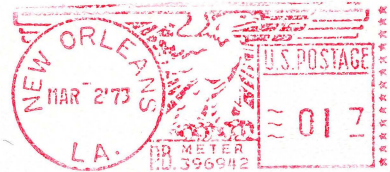
