City of Coralville Pools Summer 2020 Information

The Coralville Pools will open June 29 for recreational swimming with modifications to capacity, hours, rules, and with extra precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Chlorine is a fast acting disinfectant against COVID-19 and other illnesses, and COVID 19 has not been found to be spread through pool water.

Please read through all information so you can prepare for your visit to the Coralville Community Aquatic Center or the Coralville Indoor Pool.

Hours & Admission

Coralville Community Aquatic Center

Monday – Friday 12:00** - 4:15 p.m. \$5 per person Monday – Thursday 5:30 - 8:00 p.m. \$4 per person

There is no readmittance between sessions. The fee is paid for each session of swimming.

Saturday/Sunday 12:00** – 6:00 p.m. \$5 per person

The air temperature must be above 70 degrees for the aquatic center to open.

**Coralville Resident-Only Early Admission: Noon - 1:00 p.m. Daily

We will admit Coralville residents only for entry daily from Noon to 1:00 p.m. All residents must provide proof of residency on entry by a driver license or a Johnson County Community ID, a piece of mail with name to the Coralville residential address postmarked after June 1, 2020, or a Coralville Parks and Recreation pool punch card with residency mark. We recommend that Coralville youth ages nine to 15 attending the pool without an adult, or those who don't have a form of ID, purchase a pool punch card which takes care of the ID process.

Youth must be nine years of age and be able to swim to use Coralville pools without an adult.

Coralville Indoor Pool

Admission is \$4.

Pay by cash or credit card (bills over \$20 denomination are not accepted), or an admit punch pass.

Admit Card

5 admits = \$25

10 admits = \$50

20 admits = \$100

Admit cards may be purchased at either the Coralville Recreation Center.

Passes

New pass sales have been suspended through August 31. Current passes will be honored at either pool. If entering during a Coralville resident-early admittance time, a driver license or other ID with your address must be shown.

Modified Capacity

To provide room for social distancing on deck or in grass areas, the pool capacities will be modified and monitored.

Coralville Aquatic Center Capacity and Waiting Lists

- 1. Once capacity is reached, the cashier will take names, the number in party (similar to a restaurant waiting list), and a cell phone number. Waiting swimmers will be asked to wait in the park. We discourage lines from forming.
- 2. When it is time to enter, a text will be sent to the cell phone number provided. All swimmer(s) in the party have five minutes to report to the cashier before the next party is called.

Indoor Pool

- 1. Once capacity is reached, the front desk will take names, the number in party (similar to a restaurant waiting list), and a cell phone number. Waiting swimmers will be asked to wait either in the Recreation Center gym, game room area (if open), or in the park.
- 2. When it is time to enter, the desk will call the cell number provided. All swimmer(s) in the party will have five minutes to report to the front desk before the next party is called.

Day and Summer Camp Groups

Reservations will be taken for day camps and day care groups for use of the Coralville Community Aquatic Center.

- Coralville-based day camps and day care groups may submit a request starting June 22 and may begin June 29.
- All other day camps and day care groups may place a request beginning June 29 for July 6 and beyond.

Coralville Parks and Recreation staff will review all requests for swimming by groups and will assign slots to swim. Groups will be assigned no more than two slots per week. **Groups must arrive between 12:30**

and 1:00 p.m. If a group has not arrived by 1:00 p.m., they will forfeit their swimming spots. The reservation form may be found at www.coralville.org/poolreservation.

Cleaning and Sanitizing

Staff will periodically sanitize high-touch surfaces throughout each swim session and at the afternoon session break. Surfaces are not cleaned between each individual user.

Social Distancing

The City of Coralville encourages social distancing while using our decks, locker rooms, and grass spaces. Social distancing while in the water may be difficult. Parks and Recreation staff will not monitor social distancing practices.

Masks

Masks are the choice of the pool user while out of the water. For the safety of the pool user, masks will not be allowed in the water or on the splash pad. Chlorine is a fast-acting killer of COVID-19. Staff have the choice to wear a mask while at work but the City of Coralville has not mandated the use of masks.

Splash Parties

Splash parties have been suspended for this summer.
