Much rice is grown in this part of the world that it is called "The Rice Bowl of the World."

Observe the red, white and blue <u>flag</u> of Cambodia which has the same colors as the flag of the United States of America.

There is a difference in the pattern or design and the colors represent different meanings. The red in the Cambodian flag symbolizes blood or bravery; blue means the unity of the people of that country and the white temple in the center of the flag represents purity and peace.

Do you see the <u>tiger</u> peeking from behind the orange tree? He looks like he just finished eating because he's licking his lips or maybe he's thinking about something he'd like to eat! What do you suppose the tiger ate or is thinking of eating? See the monkey in the orange tree?

Above the map we see the <u>elephants</u>. Elephants in Cambodia are used for transportation of people and for hauling or pulling heavy objects. Wouldn't you like to ride on an elephant?

In the United States we must go to the zoo to see these wild animals in cages. In Cambodia, because of the very thick forests called jungles, these wild animals are common and live in the jungle.
