Dear Sir:

I want to express to you my feeling that it is time for the Watergate matter, and related affairs to be turned entirely over to the courts. While I realize it is the nature of politics for the President's enemies to keep after him as long as he is in office, I do think that there is a growing sentiment among the American people that the harm done by a continued over-emphasis on these matters will outweigh any good that can be done and that it is time for the Congress to get away from them. Let's leave these matters to the Justice Department and to the courts. Congress ought to be concerning itself with far more important matters.

Even if the President has been guilty of improprieties in the past all the attention constantly focused on him at this present time and during the rest of his administration will make it nearly impossible for him to do things that are wrong or dishonest. Most Americans are tired of those who are trying to make political gain out of the tragic events of the past. Let's hope our President has learned from the things that have taken place and will be wiser now in leading the Nation. Let's appreciate the good things he has done. I am just one who wants you to know that I hope you will help your fellow Congressmen to quit looking backwards, and to deal in a wiser way with the present and future problems.

I do appreciate all the good things you do in representing Oklahoma.
