This is a sample of the efforts to destroy our Nation. This should be removed if it takes an act of Congress. Please advise what is being done or can be done to remedy this outrage to our Country.

It appears that the Ervin Committee has spent enough making hay and cutting below the stubble. If this investigation is of the President, it should have been in the House Judiciary Committee in the beginning. The Watergate break-in was so stupid that the instigators should have been sent to a mental institution.

Dear Mr. Farley and Mr. Patterson:

Thank you very much for communicating with me concerning your opinions on the question of impeachment and the H.H. Booker II Mural.

After several resolutions of impeachment were introduced last year, the House Judiciary Committee was assigned the responsibility of investigating the facts to determine whether there was evidence to personally implicate the President in an impeachable offense.

A staff was assembled in December to begin this study. It is expected that the Judiciary Committee staff investigation will be completed sometime in April. At that time, the evidence will be presented and a vote taken to determine whether impeachment proceedings should begin or be dropped.

Most House Members, including myself, believe that we should keep an open mind and decide on the basis of the legal evidence which is presented later in the spring.

In the meantime, Congress has a full agenda of important business in the areas of energy, the economy, and other domestic legislation which will occupy my work and attention.

Regarding the H.H. Booker painting, you will be pleased to know that this controversial mural has been removed, and a new mural entitled "The Second Hundred Years, Part I" by Mr. Herbert Parham is now being displayed. This mural is part of a series which will change every three weeks. It contains famous men and women in our Nation's history.

Thank you very much for taking the time to share your views with me.
