Attached is a telegram sent by me 10/27/73. Thru error, on purpose or otherwise, my message was changed. I called Western Union upon receipt of this copy to have it corrected. I have not received corrected copy as of this time. I have underlined the errors by Western Union.

My wife, Gladys, and I belong to only one group, The Silent Majority, and I can no longer stay silent. Below is a list of our thoughts and wishes.

- Please do not resign.
- Fight impeachment if forthcoming.
- Stop exports of oil and Natural Gas.
- Do not tax gasoline.
- Do not ration gasoline.
- Take Smog Devices off cars, pass law to force tune ups on cars every 10,000 miles.
- Get on with Alaskan pipeline (not thru Canada).
- Press Congress for passage of Private Pension Plan as passed by Senate 93-0 on 9/19/73.
- Support Gerald Ford for Vice President.
- Do Not raise social security benefits under threat of not increasing debt limit.
- We like your handling of Mid East crisis.

The biggest problem you face as I see it, in communications, is that CBS, NBC, ABC AND Time Magazine are trying to make the news instead of reporting it. Pound away at this with as much free time as you can get on TV.

My wife Gladys and I do not make or break anyone with our votes but we are two who will stand by Our President.


