

By virtue of the decree of the court in the case  
of Jane v. <sup>vs</sup> Lanier &c. - made in Chancery by  
the Circuit Supr. Court of Petersburg the 13th of June  
1840, a copy of which is hereto annexed, I  
afford the said Jane publicly this day agreeable  
to the terms & conditions of sd. decree, when R. S. P.  
C. Traylor agreed to take her & her children & increase  
for fourteen years from this date, - he being the lowest  
bidder - for the sum of \$170.90 payable the 1st  
of November 1840, that being the sum necessary  
to be raised, as per statute annexed - which note  
I hold subject to the order of Court: - I gave to C.  
Traylor possession of sd. Jane & her children, with  
a receipt upon a copy of sd. decree, taking from  
him a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars  
conditioned to support & maintain said sd.  
Jane & her children & their increase during the  
term aforesaid. & for other things in the condition of  
sd. bond specified, said bond is herewith returned.  
I have paid to David May the attorney for the  
plain tiff in the cases stated as hereto annexed  
the amounts due to sd. plain tiff's respectively  
as will appear by his receipt annexed.
