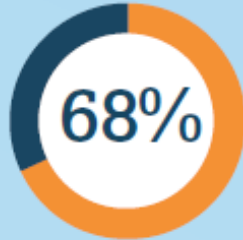

Diamond Apartment Homes, Anaheim

- 25 one and two bedroom units for MHSA households
- Onsite Resident Services & Case Management
- Residents pay less than 30% of income towards rent





Rockwood Apartments, Anaheim

- 70 apartment with 15 apartments for MHSA clients and 48 units for families with children considered homeless by Anaheim schools
- Onsite case management & resident services
- Residents pay less than 30% of income towards rent
- LEED Gold





Wesley Village, Garden Grove-UMC Campus

- Senior residential building-16 units
- Family residential building-31 units
- OC Head Start learning center
- Service center for Lestonnac Free Clinic, Boys & Girls Club, Alzheimer's OC, Project Hope Alliance





NEW CONSTRUCTION: Santa Ana Veterans Village



- 75 one and two bedroom units for Veterans who are chronically homeless
- On site case management & resident services
- Construction start Q1 2019



Acquisition-Rehab: Econolodge, Anaheim



- 70 studio apartments with kitchenettes
- Conversion of hotel to Permanent Supportive Housing development
- Financed with tax credits, VASH vouchers, and MHSA funds

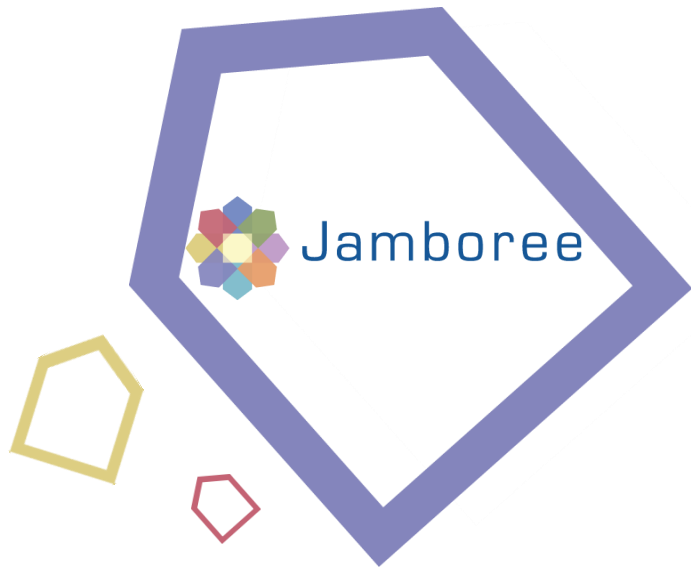




Formerly Homeless Gains Independence
