Joseph Lawrence Baylor departed this life on April 6, 2000. He was born in Newport News, Va. on March 23, 1920. He was the second child born to Charles and Louise Davenport Baylor.

Joseph attended the public schools of Newport News, Va. and graduated from Huntington High School in Newport. After which he served his country as a Sergeant in the U.S. Army during World War II. He then went on to graduate from Hampton University, Hampton, Va. Shortly after coming to Kingsport Joseph joined Central Baptist Church. He was a very faithful and supportive member up to his illness. He has served in the church as a Trustee, a Sunday School Superintendent and for 40 years a Sunday School teacher.

As requested by the President of Hampton University, Joseph had the honor of representing Hampton University by participating in the Academic Processional at the Inauguration of President Thomas R. Norris at Emory and Henry College, Emory, Va.
