

JOINT MEETING IS TO BE HELD MONDAY

American Legion and Women's Auxiliary to Meet Together in Community "Y"

A joint meeting of Hammond Post No. 3 of the American Legion and the Ladies' Auxiliary of the post will be held at the Community "Y" here at 8 o'clock Monday night, it was announced today by Post Commander C. P. Edwards Jr.

A short business meeting will be held first, to be followed by a program furnished by various entertainers among the men of the post and the ladies of the auxiliary. Among the former Jake Herrens will feature with his banjo. Following this program refreshments will be served.

It is urged that all members of the post and of the auxiliary be present, and that all eligible for either organization also attend. A membership drive is now in progress, and it is hoped that a number of new members will be added to the Legion with the next few weeks.

It is announced that the local post will give another minstrel show some time in November. Arrangements for this event will also be discussed at the meeting Monday night.

NEGROES PLAN SPECIAL RALLY

Rev. W. R. Marbury, the new pastor of the colored Methodist Episcopal church here, is planning a special rally to raise \$500 or more to repair the church building, which is located on the Bristol highway. This church is a frame building and was never entirely completed. It is also somewhat in disrepair at the present time. However, with the sum of \$500 it is believed that it can be made a creditable place in which to worship, and it is believed that no difficulty will be encountered in raising this moderate sum.

Rev. Marbury has just arrived in this city from Chattanooga to take charge of the church of his people here. Although he is himself a Meth-

odist Episcopal, he is more of a community man, and will be a leader in community work among the negroes of Kingsport. For the last month or so there have been no services at the colored church on the Bristol highway, but from now on services will be held there regularly every Sunday.
