

DOUGLAS SCHOOL WINS MUSIC CONTEST

Douglas high school of Bristol won the third annual music contest of the Interstate Extra-Curricular Activity Association, held Friday night at Douglas high school of Kingsport. Douglas high of Kingsport took second place.

The association, designed to create friendly rivalry among colored schools in Southwest Virginia and East Tennessee, has a membership of seven schools; King's Mountain of Abingdon, Douglas of Kingsport, Langston of Johnson City, Greeneville high school, Tanner of Newport and Douglas of Bristol, Va.
