FRIENDSHIP BAPTIST CHURCH HISTORY

1894 - 1985

It was in 1894, that a small group of Baptist believers, under the leadership of the Rev. C. W. McGee, met in the warehouse of Doughty-Stevens on Depot Street to organize the Friendship Baptist Church. Worship services were held in the warehouse for some time.

The Rev. Farmer followed Rev. McGee and moved the congregation to a little house on Railroad Street, which was soon enlarged to meet the needs of the growing membership. Under Rev. Farmer's leadership, the first parsonage was built near the church site.

Other ministers to serve the church at the Railroad Street location included Rev. Snow, Nathaniel Tolliver, A. R. Thompson, J. B. Thompson and J. M. Thompson. The three (3) Thompsons were brothers. The church was remodeled under the leadership of Rev. J. M. Thompson, who served as pastor until his death.

In 1925, the Rev. H. J. Bailey accepted the pastorate and served until 1928. The Rev. W. H. Stokely of South Lynchburg, Va., came as pastor in 1928. He was an energetic young man who saw that the growing membership needed a larger building.

Through the power of God and the work of the members and many citizens of the community, the dream of a new church became a reality in 1934. It was then that the congregation moved into the present structure which surely stands as a monument to Rev. Stokely who labored here for nearly eighteen (18) years.

The Rev. G. Allen Boyd of Pink Hill, N. C., followed Rev. Stokely. The church progressed financially and improvements were made to meet the needs of modern development during Rev. Boyd's pastorate, including the purchase and renovation of another parsonage. This was the site where the present parsonage stands.

In 1951, the Rev. W. C. Morrison of Louisiana, came as pastor. He placed major emphasis on a junior church and other outstanding accomplishments were made during his pastorate.

The Rev. R. L. Addision served the church for a very brief period.

In 1956, the Rev. C. C. Mills of Jefferson City, accepted the pastorate. Under his leadership, the church is still progressing spiritually and financially and many major improvements have been made.

In 1963, the present parsonage was constructed at a cost of \$30,000 (a debt which was paid in full six years later).

A disaster to be long remembered was the fire that almost destroyed the church in February of 1958. Hard work by the members and efficient guidance by Rev. Mills soon restored the building.

In December, 1980, ground was broken for a new addition to house the education department. It was completed in early spring the following year. The sanctuary was also enlarged and completely renovated. A new baptistry was installed and a ramp was built to meet the needs of all members and visitors. Other beautification measures were also made. In less than three (3) years, Oct. 31, 1983, the \$72,000.00 indebtness on this project was paid in full.

In the spring of 1983, the parking lot adjacent to the church was repaved at a cost of \$2,500.00.

We also take pride in our bus ministry which was initiated some years ago. We have acquired two (2) vans which are used to transport anyone desiring to attend church functions.


