

Cordelia Josephine Manuel was the principal at a one-room school in Chuckey for three years during the late 1940's. Children still attended this same schoolhouse built in 1904 that had no electricity or plumbing. The room had a round-belly stove in the middle and was heated from coal stored underneath the school. A blackboard and the teacher's desk were at the front of the class, and students shared desks or benches. A bucket was used to draw drinking water from the well and the boy's and girl's outhouses were in the back of the schoolhouse. Cordelia was the daughter of Frank Manuel.
