SIR—Allow me to thank you for the very kind notice of the colored School which you published in your issue of last week, and hope you will at your convenience make the School a visit, and then you can see the School in working order, with which I think you will be well pleased. If in your intercourse with the colored people on the other side you find any children between the ages of six and twelve who are not going to school, you are requested to urge them to attend, and if there are any special cases, a note from you in their behalf shall receive due consideration. You will understand we are taking the small children from both Goodson and Bristol without discrimination. It is the purpose of the Mission to open a School for the large children as soon as a building can be procured.
