MRS. NENA GOINS SMITH

Mrs. Smith, a life-long resident of Morristown, Tennessee, was a student at Morristown Seminary from the first grade through the twelfth grade and graduated from Morristown College in 1919. She attended Wilberforce University from 1919-21. Mrs. Smith received her Bachelor's of Science Degree from Tennessee A & I State University in 1949 and her Master's Degree from the same institution in 1952.

She taught in the school system of Morristown and Hamblen County for 46 years where she assisted with the system's integration. During her long career, Mrs. Smith also served as Director of the Child Development Day Care Center at Morristown College for 10 years.

The widow of Lewis Smith, to whom she was married for 55 years, Mrs. Smith is the mother of Lewis Smith, Jr. and has one grandson, Lewis Smith, III, both son and grandson are basketball coaches in Albany, GA. She has one great grand-daughter, Danielle Smith.

A faithful member of Bethel United Methodist Church and the Morristown College Alumni Association, Mrs. Smith continues to be an active 35 year member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. She is also a member of Phi Delta Kappa Sorority and the Phyllis Wheatly Reading Club. Her hobbies are crocheting and stamp collecting.

Born in Morristown, Tennessee, Mrs. Edythe Dickenson attended Morristown Seminary, entering in the second grade and completing her Associate of Arts degree. A native of Morristown, Tennessee, Mrs. Drewery was raised in Knoxville but returned to Morristown to enter the sixth grade at Morristown Seminary. She was a student from that time until she received the Associate of Arts Degree from Morristown College in 1931. She entered Knoxville College in 1931 and graduated in 1933 with a Bachelor of Arts degree.

Elder Prophet was born in Hamblen County in what is now known as the Alpha Community. At the age of 16, he moved to Knoxville, TN. where he remained until 1920 at which time he moved to Pittsburgh, PA. to work in the Pennsylvania Coal mines for ten years. He then moved to Harlan, KY. and worked in the Kentucky Coal Mines; during his stay there, he entered the Christian Ministry as a preacher in the African Methodist Episcopal Church. He returned to Morristown and joined Faith Temple Church of God in Christ, where he is currently a member and Assistant Pastor.

Elder Prophet, a faithful supporter of Morristown College, served as: the first scout-master of Black Boy Scout Troop, "County-Wide" Pastor, officiating at hundreds of funerals and weddings across Morristown and Hamblen County, presently an active member of the Hamblen County Ministerial Association, one of the founders of the Hamblen County Ministerial Association, where he is still an active member. He is one of only two of the surviving founders, the other of whom is E.H. Bregg, now of Hartford Connecticut. Elder Prophet served as Secretary/Treasurer of Hamblen County Ministerial Association for more than twenty years and served as treasurer for the City Cemetery Fund from 1960 until March 1988.
