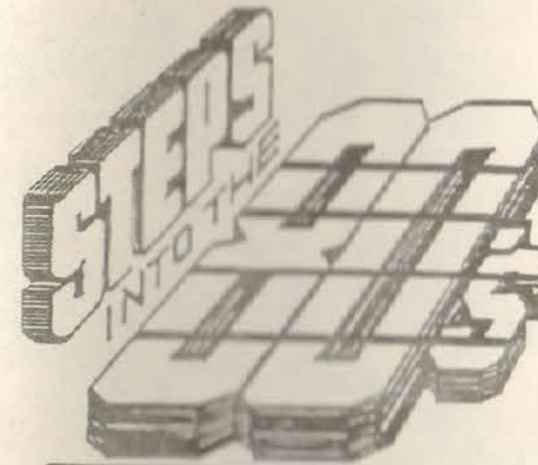

## HISTORY OF THE ORGANIZATION

Morristown Alumnae Chapter was chartered on March 28, 1981. At that time the Chapter had 13 charter members; four years later chapter membership stands at 28.

Since its inception, Morristown Alumnae has worked diligently toward the success of public service projects in addition to the support which we give to national programs of educational development, housing and urban development and mental health. Locally, we support the Progressive Child Development Center; adopted Dockery-Yearly Funeral Home; provide a yearly \$500 scholarship to Morristown College; provide two scholarships to the winner and first runner-up of the annual "Miss Bronze" pageant; Mothers March of Dimes; Heart Fund; Toys for Tots; African Relief Fund, American Red Cross; Single Parent Program and the Mitchell Southerland Home for retarded adults. In 1986-87, our efforts will include a tutorial program to assist elementary school students in the basic areas of reading, writing and arithmetic, and Foster Children's program in addition to continuing most of the above-named projects.
