



JOHN WESLEY METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH

The present building of John Wesley Methodist Episcopal church was begun during the summer of 1914, under the pastorate of Rev. W. L. Sanders. The old and dilapidated frame structure was torn away and the lot graded down a few feet. The foundation was then started. The pastor, officials and congregation commenced this building with only time of eighteen months or more this building was in progress enough money was raised and work donated by the membership to complete a structure now fully worth \$15,000, at

which time there remained only about \$4,000 indebtedness. This is one of the most substantial buildings in the city, and has every modern convenience. The church has a Sunday school room, ladies' Bible class, infants, class room, kitchen, and ladies' and gentlemen's toilets in the basement. Upstairs is the choir room, pastor's study, ladies' parlor, the auditorium and gallery. The membership all told, probationers included, is 240. The modern conveniences and endurableness of this building make it one of the best in this city or section of the country. The building in the auditorium and gallery will furnish a seating capacity of 600.
