Instructions for the principal and teachers: (This report is due at end of second school month.)

Only pupils completing the eighth grades in an *approved* elementary school may be issued eighth grade certificates. (Code of Tennessee Sections 2382-2383.) Schools satisfactorily meeting the requirements outlined in Preliminary Form and Final Form will be approved. All requirements of the State Board of Education must be met before the school can be approved. See inside back cover for Rules and Regulations Governing the Approval of Rural Elementary Schools.

In school systems sharing in State equalization funds, no school shall be considered in determining the cost of the minimum program unless it meets the requirements of the State Board of Education for an approved school. (Public Acts 1947, Chapter 8, Section 10.)

1. Each teacher in an elementary school seeking approval must submit this report to the principal in time for the principal to make a combined report to the county superintendent not later than the end of the second month of school. Each teacher must keep a copy of her report in the school register available for examination by County and State officials. All questions must be answered as they apply to the pupils in the classroom of the teacher making the report. For example, "Can all children be seated comfortably?" should be answered "Yes" if all children under her instruction can be seated comfortably. "Are the grounds clean and well kept?" should be answered "Yes" or "No" according to the teacher's evaluation of the conditions which prevail.

2. Each principal of an elementary school seeking approval must submit a combined report of the school in triplicate, using this form, immediately after the end of the second month of school.

3. The county superintendent should send the copy of this report marked "State Office" to the State Department of Education as soon as all schools finish the second month of school. (Include one copy of report card used in county.)

Preliminary Information Necessary to Warrant the Approval of this School See rules and regulations of State Board of Education on the inside back cover of Register.

- 1. Is there a separate classroom for each teacher?
- 2. Can all children be seated comfortably?
- 3. Are the school buildings free from marks, clean, and well kept?
- 4. Are the grounds clean and well kept?
- 5. Does the school have at least two sanitary toilets (one for boys and one for girls) constructed according to State approved plans and kept free from marks?
- 6. Is there an adequate supply of pure drinking water? (Any water supply that is unprotected from surface contamination cannot be classified as safe.)
- 7. How many months will this school be in session this scholastic year? (Give number.)
- 8. Do the principal and teachers hold valid elementary teachers' certificates or permits?
- 9. Is the school opened and closed each day at the time fixed by the county board of education?
- 10. Is the register kept at the school and a record of attendance made each day before leaving the school building?

- 11. Is the Bible read at the opening of each school day as prescribed by law?
- 12. Is instruction given in physical education as required by law and official regulations?
- 13. Are at least two fire drills given each month during the school year?
- 14. Is forestation taught as required by Sections 2424-2427 of the Code of Tennessee?
- 15. Are the Constitutions of the United States and the State of Tennessee taught as required by law?
- 16. Does the principal serve as custodian of the school during the school term?
- 17. Is the county superintendent furnished with a complete list of absentees at the end of each week?
- 18. Is instruction given all pupils for at least fifteen minutes each week in the art of safety as prescribed by law?
- 19. Is the United States flag displayed on the school building and/or grounds, and does each teacher give instruction to the pupils and have the pupils study as a part of the curriculum the uses, purposes, and methods of displaying the American flag and other patriotic emblems?
- 20. Will the following days be observed as required by law: Bird, Flower and Arbor Day (first Friday in March); Frances E. Willard Day (fourth Friday in October)?
- 21. Are all children who attend this school of legal school age? (Beginners who are six or who will be six by December 31 may enter at the beginning of school. They must enter during the first thirty days of the school year.)
- 22. Do all teachers observe rules and regulations relative to teachers made by the State and county boards of education?
- 23. Is the State course of study used as the basis of the instructional program planned for this school?
- 24. Does each teacher possess and use bulletins issued by the State Department of Education pertaining to elementary schools?
- 25. Are adequate equipment and instructional supplies readily accessible to all teachers and pupils? (In order to answer this question in the affirmative the school must have and use all items on the list of minimum equipment and supplies approved by your county superintendent and the State Supervisor of Elementary Schools. A list checked and signed by the principal *must be attached* to this report.)
- 26. Is there a library center in each classroom? (Minimum equipment—bookcase or shelves, tables and chairs) (Library centers will *not* be required for classrooms above the third grade in schools having a central reading room used by the students.)


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
